Robert (1) Barnard and his wife, Joan-said to be Joan Harvey-had a homelot adjoining Simon Bradstreet's, in North Parish. He was one of the original ten Church members here, and came with the others, from New-bury. Frank King Barnard, historian, thought that Robert came to Andover in 1644 and served in the Indian War during a raid in 1659- about which I have no record.

Robert had a brother Thomas (1) of Newbury who had a share in the new settlement at Nantucket where he was one of the ten original proprietors. As each of the ten was privileged to vote one new member, Those voted his brother Robert of Andover, so in 1663 he-Robert- and his family left our settlement for the one on the island.

In June, 1667, Robert (1) Barnard and wife, Joan, of Nantucket, sold to Simon Bradstreet, for L 120, all the land they owned in Andover, including that which they bought from Joseph Wright, - 12:60, Salem deeds.

Thomas remained in Newbury, where he died, and Robert (1) stayed on at Nantucket until his death in 1682. Joan died in 1705.

The children of Robert (1) and wife Joan, were :-

- John (2), who went to Mantucket with his father. He was b. in Salisbury, fan. 2,1642. He m. in 1668, Bethia Folger, daughter of Peter Folger of Nantucket. Both were drowned in June 1669, in Boston harbor while journeying north in a boat.
- Hannah (2) b. here in the woods of Andover, about 1644-5; m. June 13, 1662, John (2) Stevens, son of John (1) and Elizabeth; she d. 1675. Children were John(3); Nathan(3); and Joshua(3). Queer that nobody recalls Joann- but Hannah had no girls. Later in the line, Joanna, was used by Ebenezer(3), but it was a Sprague name.

I have never seen the case, but it was for 4 acres, worth & 8,- and is on record somewhere. The 4 acres were clearly sold to George Abbott for 18 before Robert (1) left Andover, and the other land was sold in 1679 to Bradstreet, after Barnards had made their home in Nantucket. It was a case of diamond cut diamond. Bradstreet wished to buy out the non-residents and control the Division Lots and hoped he had gotten rid of Robert Barnard. R.King Barnard, said that Robert (1) had a lawsuit on when he left and that Robert(3) revived it as adm. of the estate of his grandfather. dec., formerly of Andover.) Stephen probably took up land for himself. He m. Rebecca Howe; she d. 1725; he d. at 74, in 1722.
- Martha (2), b. here before 1658(I feel sure); m. William Rogers of Martha's Vineyard.
- Sarah (2) b. very likely, 1658; she m. 1677, James (2) Skiffe of Marthaj

Vineyard, son of Jas.(1) Skiffe and w. Sarah Reaves.-Nantucket Deeds, march 10, 1677: James Skiffe to espoused wife, Sarah Barnard- he of Tisbury-she of Sherborn- a marriage contract. In 1679 they convey the estate of Robert(1) Barnard, dec.,-and one tract was given because they promise to maintain the widow, Joan.

FACTS ABOUT ROBERT(1) BARNARD and COURT PAPERS.

Robert(1) Barnard and wife Joan are mentioned but once on the Town Records, then- as parents of Mary, b. 1657. The Hanna Barnard who married John (2) Stevens in 1662(s.1675) was probably their daughter, as Hanna of Salisbury, daughter of THOMAS, married Benj. Stevens, and an 1697, as widow of this Salisbury resident, signs the receipt for money paid her by her youngest brother, John, who admentis deceased mother's estate "in the reign of our Soverign Lord William III."

The next paper concerning our Robert, who was one of the first ten church members in Andover, is his deed to Simon Bradstreet in June, 1667; - Robert and Joan, his wife, convey their land for 120 b.

From Savage's volume, I learn that the Nantucket folks claim Nathaniel of Salisbury, son of Thomas, as ancestor of all the Barnards down there; that he came there, with his uncle Robert, in 1650, from England.

Thomas Barnard of Salisbury had a son Nathaniel who was of Nantucket when the 1697 papers were signed. He is said to have married his cousin- the daughter of his uncle Robert- probably the Mary of Andover. He died there shortly after the death of his wife, in 1718.

Savage goes on to say that Robert from Salisbury, brother of aforesaid Thomas, had only one son, John, b. 1642, and that Robert moved to Nantucket 1663 and died there 1682, his widow, Joan, living until 1705. He says also that son John married Bethia Folger, daughter of Peter, Feb. 1669, and both were drowned on a trip to Boston, the following June.

Savage does not seem to connect his Robert with our man at all.

It is very plain that Robert visited Nantucket in 1650 with a nephew, Nathaniel. John, in 1663, when he was 21, took his parents to Nantucket. The three children, born in Andover, Hanna, Stephen and Mary, were not credited to Robert in the Salisbury records, where he lived before Cochichewick was started.

When, through the death of John, Robert's hopes on his rights to return to Andover, fail, he sends his son Stephen within the year. Stephen in 1671 marries Rebecca Howe, probably a resident of the Methuen hill near the Haverhill border, held so long by the Howes.

Robert, Sr., held land rights until 1714, and the se fell to his grandson, Robert, to settle. The litigation in the Robert Barnard Proprietors' Rights, is too long a story to take up here but 4 acres worth E8 remained to old Robert, who probably spent his last days with his daughter Mary and nephew Nathaniel.

The children of Stephen (2) and those of Mary (2), wife of
John Stevens are his descendants in old Andover. I will leave
wiser heads to connect Francis Barnard's family of Hadley, 1660
with this line. Most likely Francis was closely connected with John
Barnard of Watertown, as their children both select wives from the
Goffe family of Cambridge. Francis' son, Thomas, graduated from Cambridge with the class of 1679 and went to Andover to help the Rev.

Dane,
Francis Dane, in 1682. He/was then nearly 70 years old.

Young Thomas Barnard was to have 50L a year, while Mr. Dane preached—one fourth of the amount only, in silver—wheat and corn firewood and the use of the parsonage, making up the total. He was to have 80 L when Mr. Dane's work was over. That may have ceased in 1686 when Elizabeth Price came up to be his helpmate.

The young couple then started to catch up with Stephen (2), of Robert(1)'s line, who in 15 years, had gotten back some of the old estate which had passed into the hands of "Walter Wright and Joseph Marble, near Capt. Christopher Osgood and James/Barnard's estate". as it is described in 1714, a few years before Stephen's death, when his sons, Robert, John and Stechen(3), pass a parcel about among them. . A few months later when Joseph Wright emigrates to Conn., he parts, for 120 L with the land his father bought from Joseph Marble, to the Barnard heirs. Whether or not it was part of Robert(1)'s original holding, the family of Stephen (2) had a fair inheritance up on the old Indian trail along the Frye Village Ridge, through from the Frye School House over to the fish-way at Bodwell's Ferry, held by a Barnard as late as 1838. (Get off the car at Tompkins, take the road just North of the Andover line and walk West to the old road, then back south to thelast cross-way near Donald's.)

Stephen's daughter, Hanna (3), married her playmate, Joseph Marble, at 17. Robert (3) took for a wife, neighbor Christopher Osgood's daughter, Rebecca. Stephen(3) married Hanna Bixby, of another Merrimac family, while James with his wife Abigail, form another plantation, as do John and his Naomi-possibly a sister of Dorothy Hoyt who married John Lovejoy about the same time.

The home farm went in John(3) 's line. He outlived his son, dying at 82, in 1756. Amy, or Naomi, lived on until 1762, until she was 90. John(3) s last words:-"This husbandman, advanced in years, even to old age of a perfect mind and memory, thanks be to God"-leaves all to his beloved Naomi; to John's children, '5 sh. added to all I gave John when he was alive" and legacies for his daughters and their husbands, and to Mary, the daughter of his dead son, Nathaniel, who married a neighboring Shattuck lad.

Nathaniel (4) married Ruth Preston, and the Mary mentioned in her grandsir's will was the only child who lived. John(4) died intestate, and from inventory and appraisal I was able to get an idea of his widow's homestead.

John (4) married 1st, Sarah Osgood. Her children were: Sara, Jemwho died young.
ima, Addis, John, Jacob and an infant daughter, His second wife, Mehitabel,
died in 1739, with no record of children in Town or County. He then married Alice Holt. who survived him, with six children.

Jacob the youngest is taken into consideration when the neighbors go down to Court to begin the serious business of making a just division of his large estate. Widow Ruth(Nath(4), goes down the same day to look after the estate of her daughter Mary.

Nathaniel(4) 's estate consisted of 50 acres of the homestead; the dead children's clothes; a good library; husk bed, silk blanket; a cradle; loom, flax and such a quantity of Sheep, Beef and Calf skins, he would appear to have been a "boss" shoemaker, besides manufacturing cloth and blanker.

Abbott take charge...Brother John's affairs are cared for by Thomas Holt, for his sister Alace, the widow, and I imagine he had a shrewd man to deal with in young John(5).

The ancient Barnard homestead at the turn of the road in Frye Village fell to John, with the house to the North- and barn across the way; woodland, 60 acres at Wolfpit, worth 100 L; his father's stock and the best coat, with much pine boards and lumber- the only hint that he was possibly a carpenter.

Thomas Holt calls on widow Ruth's men to help, and they divide the estate into sections. Some is sold for necessary cash to pay small debts-"eorge Abbott and Samuel Phillips among the creditors. Dr. Noyes and Dr. Abbott have pretty good bills against the estate. John Crow, who asks for 19 sh., is probably a hired man or forced servant.

Widow Alice, for her dower got her share of the dwelling-house, from the bottom of the cellar to the top of the chimney, with well and garden rights. St. John Poor and Thomas Wardwell are neighbors. Alice dies the same year her aged mother-in-law Naomi goes, and John pays to the six youngest of Alice's brood, 4 - apiece. To his own sister, Sara Kidder, her woodlot. Jeremia Hazelton-a new one- brings Ben Poor to help settle who shall have the last relics of his mother.

The quaint description of the woman's pair of shirts; the salk, cotton and wool and tow aprons; I pocket handkerchief; 6 caps and the precious baby linen and blankets of little Jacob, then only 12; her linen
bags, stockings, quilted coat, stuff gown, old one, plaid, silk crepe, the
long hood and handkerchief and bonnet, -give us a good idea of the wardrobe of a well-to-do farmer's wife of the day.

An array of China, plate, chopping knife and flesh fork, winding up with what appears to be a "smatter", gives us the salt mortar--and such an advance on the price of her hoard of salt as to pay the funeral expenses, - without counting the rents... Alice was a thorough Holt and saved for the thrifty Barnard girls, who all received a pretty silver gift. Her step-daughter, Sara, shared equally with her own five.

The line of FRANCIS(1) Barnard.

Francis(1) Barnard, "malster", was at Hatfield in 1647. He was one of the first settlers of Hadley, in 1659, and was in Deerfield, 1673. He retired to Hadley in King Phillip's War and died there, Feb.3, 1698. He married, before Aug. 15,1644, Hannah Marvin. His 2nd wife was Frances, daughter of Nath'l Foote and widow of John Dickinson, whom he married Aug. 21, 1677. The children of Francis and Hannah, were:

STRAY BARNARDS in ANDOVER

Dr. Franklin Barnard, married Martha A. Plummer here in 1833. He was said to be the son of Ben Keep Barnard. If so, his line would be-from Robert (1) Barnard; Stephen (2); Robert (3); Ben (4), b. about b. 1716; Ben (5), b. 1740, m. 1765; Ben (6), b. about 1775 was known as Ben Keep Barnard, m. about 1800; Dr. Franklin (7) Barnard, who m. 1833 here in Andover.

The Robert (3), above, b. 1716, m. Lucy Bush; d. in Harvard, Mass., 1791.

Henry F. Barnard of Worcester, came from Concord, N.H. about 1840; m. Mary F. Manning and took for a 2nd wife, Rebecca Manning, sister of the first. He was one of the original Free Church founders, 1846. Had a furniture shop in the old depot on Essex St. He moved to Lawrence, 1863; had a furniture store there and also manufactured small bedsteads. His shop burned shortly after he had taken it.
