THE BERRY FAMILY

Thaddeus Berry, I had from the Transcript, was in Boston, 1665, and was later in Lynn and Rumney Marsh. I had from Bodge that he enlisted under Col. John Whipple of Ipswich, June 24, 1676 in a company credited from Lynn, Aug. 24, 1676. As a soldier grantee, his claim lay in Boxton, Me., and John Mitchell bought it. A daughter, Mary Mitchell, and Ambrose Berry, seem to take it. Thaddeus married Hannah Farrar, daughter of Thomas and Elizabeth of Lynn. He died June 5, 1718. Hannah was still alive. In 1720 his estate was divided.

A son, John (2) lived in Wenham, according to the Transcript. He moved to Danvers or Salem Village, for he was taxed there in 1707. A deposition given in 1719 regarding Wenham bounds of Salem Village, said that John lived in Wenham 24 years previously and saw the Wenham line perambulated, -so he must have been in Wenham 1695.

On April 11, 1722, John (2) Berry, then of Wenham, bought of Edward Fuller of Salem Village a house and barn in Salem, 160 acres of land. The bds. were Tom Bayley, Samuel Lambert, Beadry Brook, Wm. and Joseph Fuller, Ben Fuller, the Boxford line, Daniel Kenny and Timothy Wilkins.

Later in Salem, Oct. 6, 1727, John's four sons bought of Ben Fuller, Sr., 60 acres near their own land. John (2) in a sale to his brother Tom (2) of his share of the estate in Rumney Marsh, refers to the probate that gave his share of 23 acres in that section in 1720, and said that part of his father, Thaddeus' estate lay in Boston and part in Lynn.

(Old Mr. Stiles of the Townsman files, in No. 23, said that Eben Berry, then 80 years old, told him some years earlier, that his father, Ebenezer, the proprietor of the Danvers Hotel, before him, was born in North Andover, in the last house on the line near Middleton-on the old North Road. The cellar is still to be seen near the railroad. He says the house was in the possession of Samuel Farnum in 1700 and a Berry ancestor of the Ben, spokesman, - bought a tract joining it, from Stephen Barker. (This is Andover, now) Ben Berry, gentleman, had much estate and I conclude he got the Samuel Farnum place on a mortgage.)

Stiles told of a Berry farm, now burned down, which was on the cross-road east of David Richardson's in Middleton. Lots of the family are buried there in a field across the road not far from where Peter Towne's house stands- now dilapidated. According to the tale, a man from the Berry place/^{went} to Peter Towne's and his dog followed him. While the master chopped on the woodlot, the dog played around in some straw which had been in the bed of a small-pox patient.The dog carried the disease home and the family died. The house was deserted and fell to pieces.

This was at the time that Lydia Abbott, wife of Peter Towne died of small -pox, during the Revolution- and it is said that the germ was communicated to her by a pinch of snuff at the hands of a discarded lover- very likely Ben Frye,who lived near and died of small-pox himself, the same winter

" Ebenezer Berry, age 80 in 1889, proprietor of a hotel in Danvers, said that his father, Eben, was born in North Andover in the last house on the Middleton line on the old North Road- the cellar still to be seen, near the railroad. He said that he kept some old papers that came from the old place.

It was held in 1700 by Sam Harnum and that same year an ancestor of Stiles bought some land adjoining the same farm from Stephen Barker;- 4 score rods long; 3 score rods wide- over in Andover- which was next the Salem line near the old Fuller house. (In 1728 Middleton was set off and took from Andover a mile north, and from Salem Village, 4 miles.)

The papers he referred to, allude to Eben Berry's grand-father, who had some wealth for his day;- "Salem, Dec. 25, 1746, have received of Mr. Ben Berry 200 £. payment in full for a negro boy I have this day sold him, and delivered- named Thomas Woute, etc.- " David Putnam and Tom Lee, wit

Mary Long and Mercy Berry witness a receipt, of payment of 5 £ 10sh. by Capt. Ben Berry, Aug. 20, 1766.

Eben Berry said that old Ben was a Captain in the French War. After his death the house goods were sold at auction and the grand-mother of Mr. Stiles bid in a pewter platter which she kept for many years in a buffet in the corner of the room where she lived. The house is now owned by Hiram A. Stiles.

When the writer of the article, David Stiles-(the first grand-son) crawled into her room from another part of the house, she took down the platter and put him on it and carried him to the room where his parents were eating dinner, saying, " Here he is; serve him as you see fit. If he lives to grow up, tell him how he came by this platter." ... The platter is stamped " B.B." and is of English make. Mr. Stiles said that anyone could see it but he would not part with it for \$1,000. It is very large and probably held a roast of beef at dinner, on state occasions.
