William Furber, born 1614, came from London, and was at Dover, 1637.

He was a freeman in 1653; was taxed in 1648. He was at Bloody Point, 1662
1672; had land at Welshman Cove. 1652; d. 1699.

From Andover records:-

Samuel Henry Furber, b. Sept. 1832; m. Mar. 1856, Lucy J. Chandler, b. 1827, dau.of Joshua (8) Chandler and w. Susan Clark. He d. Dec.6,1896.

He was b. in North Andover in a house in the Bailey field, on the right, just above the High School, supposedly the site of the old Bragg tavern. He lived on Elm street, No.Andover about 40 years. For the greater part of his life was employed in the mule department of Davis and Furber.

He was son of Samuel S. Fürber of Concord, N.H. and wife, Susan Adams, who were m. in Andover, April 1, 1823. She was daughter of Jn. Adams, 3rds, and w. Susanna, b. Nov.13, 1799. They also had a son:-

John A., b. July 14, 1838. Samuel S., was of the Davis and Furber Co. firm, of No. Andover.

Charles Furber, 28, a mechanic, son of Joshua and Alcey Furber, m. Dec. 25, 1845, Harriet Bradley, 28, daughter of Jos. and Charlotte.
