Work Accomplished in Department of Public Works During November

The following report of work done in the Highway and Water departments during the month of November was given by Superintendent Charles T. Gilliard at a meeting of the Board of Public Works held Saturday evening.

Highway Department. Dascomb Road from Andover street to Clark road has been covered with gravel preparatory to the construction of a hard service road.

The line of Duffon road in the vicinity of Burnham road has been relocated, which remedies an unsatisfactory condition existing heretofore.

Curbing has been set on the East side of Union street. This work was made possible under Article 10.

The incipient cracks and the expansion points on the block paving road and the new cement road on Main street have been filled with Tarvia K. P. This prevents water from getting under the road, freezing and in many instances causes an upheaval of the roadbed.

On Thursday, Nov. 27th there was a light snow followed by freezing weather, and the ice caused slippery conditions in Town. The places that threatened to prove dangerous to pedestrians and automobile traffic were thoroughly sanded.

The gutters in the vicinity of the corner of Avon and Summer streets, which accumulate much mud during the heavy rainfalls have been stoned and tarred.
