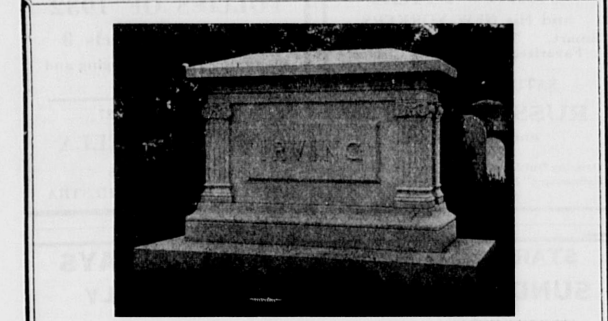

American Chow Mein: 2 tablespoons butter, 1 cup onions, coarsely chopped; 1 1/2 cups celery, coarsely chopped; 1/2 cup water, 1/2 teaspoon salt, 1 medium can Oven Baked Red Kidney Beans, 1 tablespoon flour, 2 tablespoons molasses, 2 cans chow mein noodles. Melt butter in large saucepan, add onions and cook until lightly browned. Add celery, water and salt and simmer gently 10 minutes.
