## Contract Talks Are Underway

At midnight on Monday, June 30, contracts between the town of Andover and the Police, Fire and Public Works departments lapsed.
"These are very responsible units," stated Town Manager Kenneth Mahony All three departments will continue business as usual until new agreements are negotiated and signed. According to Mahony, the delay is due to time constraints. "People tend to look at negotiations as of time spent talking," but one must take into account the "three or four hours" of preparation that are necessary for a meeting with the collective bargaining units.
Mahony contends that there will be no major alterations in any of the three contracts. Most of the negotiations are no more than clarifications that could be summarized in "a page for each 30 or 40 page contract." Another reason for the delay is that "no one wants to be firstor last."

analysis of the present structure. It is expected that work on the entrance, the circular stairway, and the assembly facility, which will be returned to its original purpose, will need to be done. Until the evaluation is completed, the town Reuse Committee cannot hold hearings to decide how the building will be utilized. That will depend a great deal on the architectural constraints of the structure. The analyses are expected to be complete by late summer or early fall.
Although the town has not made any definite plans for the ground floor, Mahony expressed the hope of moving the Post Office into the site, where it was located some time ago. "They seem to be very interested," stated Mahony, adding that the Post Office is currently working on an agreement for a site on Stevens Street. The owner of the property, Bert Paley, has completed his portion of the contract and is now waiting for word from the Post Office.
The library construction project at Memorial Hall Library is presently two months behind schedule. A skylight and windows have just been installed in the new wing which was expected to be finished in September. Work has just begun on the study, so the completion date has been pushed back to November. Mahony joked that he doesn't "think we'll be alive to see it" finished. He was quick to add that the town is under no time constraints, and that delays will not cost any additional money, but he would "rather not see it take any longer" than presently expected
Once the new wing is completed, the contents of the old wing will be tranferred to it, so that renovations may proceed on the old wing. The entire project is not expected to be finished until late next year.

Monday, June 30, Boston Conservatory President William Seymour and two trustees of the prestigious music school toured the area into which Emerson College is moving. The two schools are discussing the possibility of a merger, although Emerson President Allen E. Koenig believes that the schools will simply share courses for now and merge in about ten years.
U.S. Rep. Chester Atkins (D-5th District) arranged for the deluxe tour of Lawrence and Andover, which included rides on a bus, a boat and a sea plane for an aerial view of the properties involved. The Andover site is off River Road just north of the Lawrence city line, along the Merrimack River. It is owned by real estate developers John Corcoran and Trammel Crow.
The Conservatory is considering a move due to the lack of real estate in Boston that would allow the school to expand. Transportation of students to Boston where the Conservatory runs an opera program with their present neighbor, New England Conservatory of Music, construction costs and availabilty and price of land are all obstacles to the move.
The transportation question may already be answered. According to Andover Town Manager Kenneth Mahony, the site is served by a new bus route, connecting Downtown Lawrence with Shattuck Street. In addition, a planned highway project will make Andover Street a three-lane highway and more exit ramps from Route 93 will be added.

## Down The Years With The Townsman

75 Years Ago - July 1911
Tuesday was the quietest--and also the hotest-Fourth of July Andover has known for some years. The 'night before' observances were unusually quiet in nearly all portions of the town, and nothing in the way of a special celebration of an official nature took place on Tuesday. For the most part, the efforts of the townspeople were confined to keeping cool, or endeavoring to do so.

A collision between a horse and wagon and an Andover-bound electric car occurred Monday evening about half-past ten near Harding St. The wagon contained two women, a man and two children. At the point where the accident occurred, the road is being macademized, and as the driving was poor, the team proceeded on the car tracks. The motorman failed to see it approaching until it was too late.
Eighty children and eight teachers met to begin summer work yesterday and others sent their names for Monday.
The fire department spent several hours Saturday and Sunday fighting a brush fire on the Peter D. Smith estate in West Andover. The fire broke out again on Wednesday and more work was necessary.

The Townsman carried an editorial
stating that it was too hot to write editorials.

50 Years Ago - July 1936
At a special session of the School Board, one janitor was appointed and several contracts for summer repairs were awarded Tuesday evening. Miss Mary E.C. Geagan was unable to be present, recently having undergone a minor operation.
There are two sides to the local parking controversy which has developed in Andover since last Monday morning. First of all, there is a little book which was put out by the selectmen back in 1933 in response to numerous demands for regulation of parking on the business section of Main St. That little book contains a list of rules and regulations to govern parking and other traffic details. And in those rules and regulations is the basis on which the substitute officer launched his no-parking campaign early Monday morning.

activities in the town. He said that from the period between July 16 and July 19 , there were 12 court cases with 15 charges; seven speeding, seven stop sign violations; one no license; fines imposed amounted to $\$ 120$.

## Awarded Prize By Kennedy Library

Irene C. Crane, a teacher at Bancroft School in Andover and a resident of North Andover, has been awarded a $\$ 250$ prize by the John F. Kennedy Library for her work in teaching about state and local government and public affairs.
local government and public aftairs.
Crane developed a political awareness unit in state and local government for her sixth-grade students. The unit involved students in identifying and learning about their local and state leaders, developing and presenting opinions about current issues and understanding civic responsibility. As part of the unit activities, students conducted a public opinion survey of Andover citizens on the seat belt law, roadblocks to detect drunk drivers and the mandatory one-year jail sentence for unlawful possession of firearms. Each student was required to perform an act of citizen involvement in the community, such as tutoring a younger child, helping a senior citizen or cleaning up a neighborhood.
Crane was one of seven prize and six grant winners honored at an awards luncheon at the Kennedy Library on June 5. The prizes and grants were awarded as part of the second annual "Kennedy Library Project to Improve the Teaching of American Politics." This project was established to recognize Massachusetts teachers for creative and effective classroom work and to support program and curriculum development on a variety of topics and issues in American government, politics and history.
