Progress Slow On Library, Town Hall Construction

Renovations of both the former Andover Town Hall and Memorial Hall Library are progressing slowly.

Plans for the old Town Hall are still "a bit up in the air" according to Town Manager Kenneth Mahony. Architect Ann Baha has yet to complete an

analysis of the present structure. It is expected that work on the entrance, the circular stairway, and the assembly facility, which will be returned to its original purpose, will need to be done.

Until the evaluation is completed, the town Reuse Committee cannot hold hearings to decide how the building will be utilized. That will depend a great deal on the architectural constraints of the structure. The analyses are expected to be complete by late summer or early fall.

Although the town has not made any definite plans for the ground floor, Mahony expressed the hope of moving the Post Office into the site, where it was located some time ago. "They seem to be very interested," stated Mahony, adding that the Post Office is currently working on an agreement for a site on Stevens Street. The owner of the property, Bert Paley, has completed his portion of the contract and is now waiting for word from the Post Office.

The library construction project at Memorial Hall Library is presently two months behind schedule. A skylight and windows have just been installed in the new wing which was expected to be finished in September. Work has just begun on the study, so the completion date has been pushed back to November.

Mahony joked that he doesn't "think we'll be alive to see it" finished. He was quick to add that the town is under no time constraints, and that delays will not cost any additional money, but he would "rather not see it take any longer" than presently expected.

Once the new wing is completed, the contents of the old wing will be transferred to it, so that renovations may proceed on the old wing. The entire project is not expected to be finished until late next year.

Contract Talks Are Underway

At midnight on Monday, June 30, contracts between the town of Andover and the Police, Fire and Public Works departments lapsed.

"These are very responsible units," stated Town Manager Kenneth Mahony. All three departments will continue business as usual until new agreements are negotiated and signed. According to Mahony, the delay is due to time constraints. "People tend to look at negotiations as of time spent talking," but one must take into account the "three or four hours" of preparation that are necessary for a meeting with the collective bargaining units.

Mahony contends that there will be no major alterations in any of the three contracts. Most of the negotiations are no more than clarifications that could be summarized in "a page for each 30 or 40 page contract." Another reason for the delay is that "no one wants to be first—or last."

Monday, June 30, Boston Conservatory President William Seymour and two trustees of the prestigious music school toured the area into which Emerson College is moving. The two schools are discussing the possibility of a merger, although Emerson President Allen E. Koenig believes that the schools will simply share courses for now and merge in about ten years.

U.S. Rep. Chester Atkins (D-5th District) arranged for the deluxe tour of Lawrence and Andover, which included rides on a bus, a boat and a sea plane for an aerial view of the properties involved. The Andover site is off River Road just north of the Lawrence city line, along the Merrimack River. It is owned by real estate developers John Corcoran and Trammel Crow.

The Conservatory is considering a move due to the lack of real estate in Boston that would allow the school to expand. Transportation of students to Boston where the Conservatory runs an opera program with their present neighbor, New England Conservatory of Music, construction costs and availability and price of land are all obstacles to the move.

The transportation question may already be answered. According to Andover Town Manager Kenneth Mahony, the site is served by a new bus route, connecting Downtown Lawrence with Shattuck Street. In addition, a planned highway project will make Andover Street a three-lane highway and more exit ramps from Route 93 will be added.

To Observe Fourth Friday

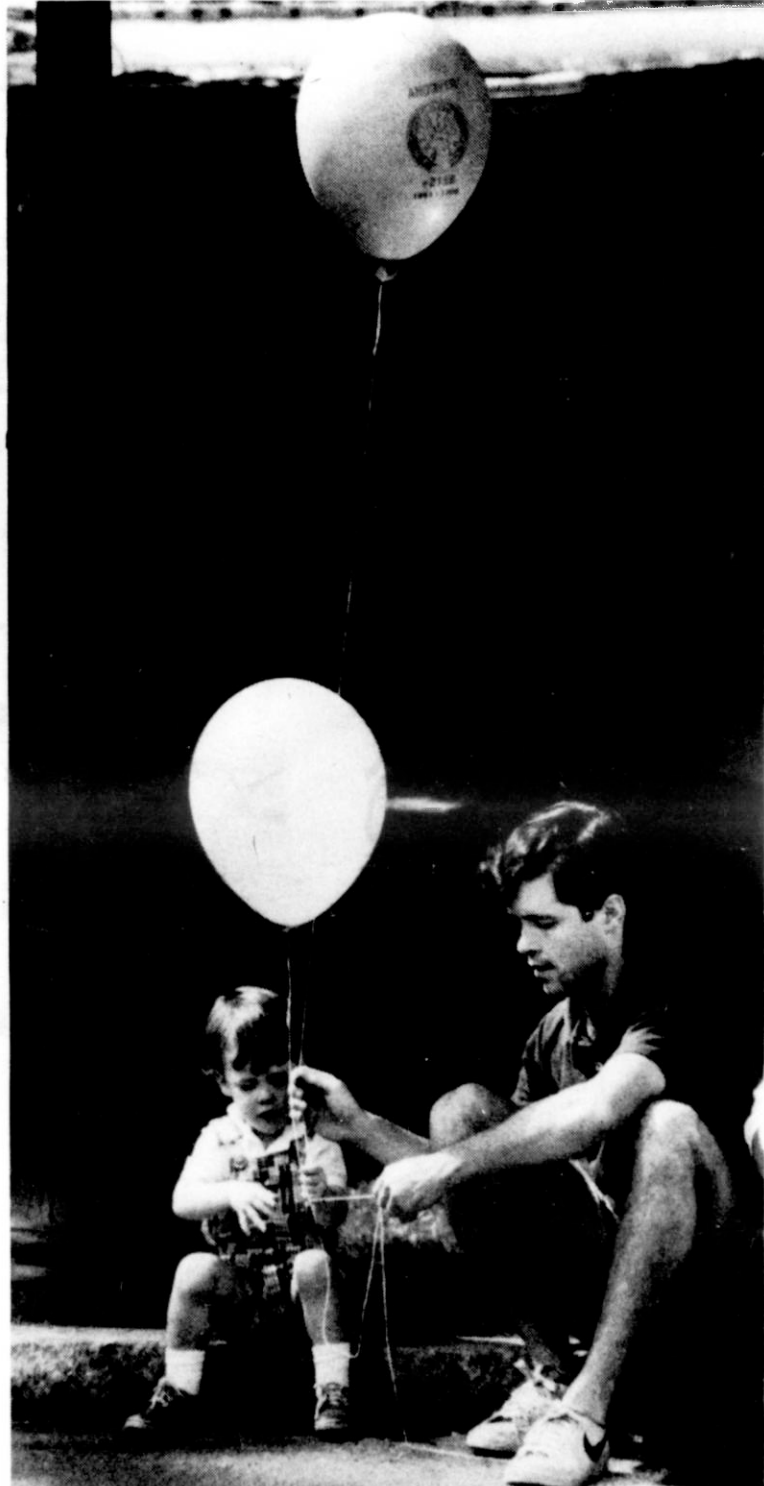
The Andover Committee for Patriotic Observances has organized a number of fun activities for the community to enjoy this Fourth of July.

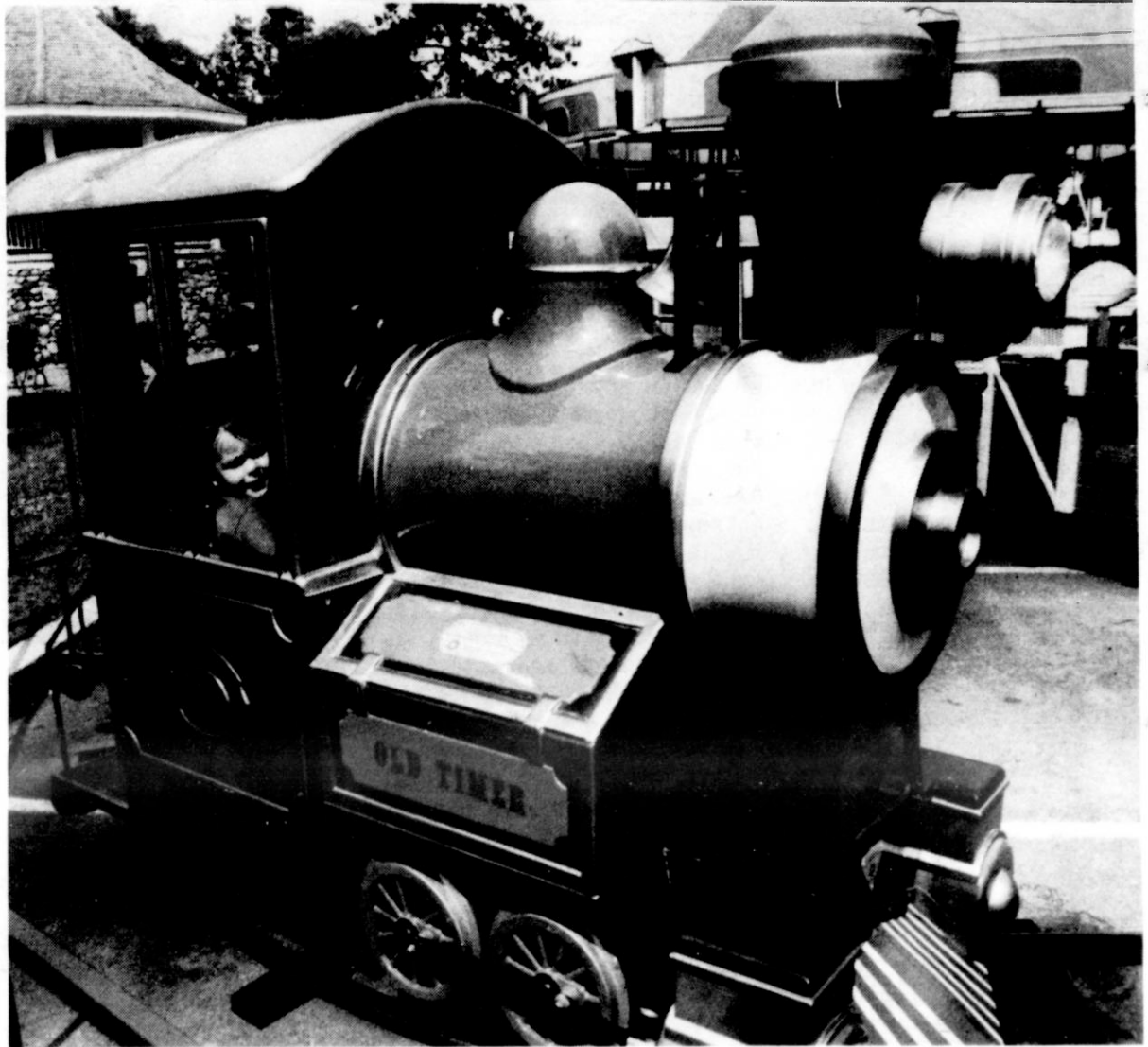
The Grand Finale will be at 11:30 a.m. with the Middlesex Concert Band in concert at the bandstand.

Down The Years With The Townsman

75 Years Ago — July 1911

Tuesday was the quietest—and also the hottest—Fourth of July Andover has known for some years. The 'night before' observances were unusually quiet in nearly all portions of the town, and nothing in the way of a special celebration of an official nature took place on Tuesday. For the most part, the efforts of the townspeople were confined to keeping cool, or endeavoring to do so.

A collision between a horse and wagon and an Andover-bound electric car occurred Monday evening about half-past ten near Harding St. The wagon contained two women, a man and two children. At the point where the accident occurred, the road is being macadamized, and as the driving was poor, the team proceeded on the car tracks. The motorman failed to see it approaching until it was too late.

Eighty children and eight teachers met to begin summer work yesterday and others sent their names for Monday.

The fire department spent several hours Saturday and Sunday fighting a brush fire on the Peter D. Smith estate in West Andover. The fire broke out again on Wednesday and more work was necessary.

The Townsman carried an editorial

stating that it was too hot to write editorials.

50 Years Ago — July 1936

At a special session of the School Board, one janitor was appointed and several contracts for summer repairs were awarded Tuesday evening. Miss Mary E.C. Geagan was unable to be present, recently having undergone a minor operation.

There are two sides to the local parking controversy which has developed in Andover since last Monday morning. First of all, there is a little book which was put out by the selectmen back in 1933 in response to numerous demands for regulation of parking on the business section of Main St. That little book contains a list of rules and regulations to govern parking and other traffic details. And in those rules and regulations is the basis on which the substitute officer launched his no-parking campaign early Monday morning.

The withdrawal of federal funds would 'certainly increase our unemployment problem,' the board of selectmen this week advised Frank H. Foy, state director of the National Emergency Council, in answer to a circular letter sent out to all Bay State local officials. The select-

men stated that the attitude of workers has changed in the past three years, and because of this, the unemployment resulting from the withdrawal of funds would be a much more serious problem to tackle.

Three local residents were bitten by dogs this week, and one of them is undergoing anti-rabies treatment as a result of a finding by state health authorities that the dog which bit her had rabies.

25 years Ago — July 1961

The Selectmen have approved the creation of eight parking places on Riverina Road and have turned thumbs down on metering the mall in Shawsheen.

Construction valued at over two and a half million dollars has been approved for Phillips Academy by the building inspector.

A telephone survey is to be made in Andover during the last week of July to determine the religious needs of the town for an additional Protestant Church here.

Town Manager Thomas E. Duff made the following report to the Board of Selectmen Monday night on traffic control

activities in the town. He said that from the period between July 16 and July 19, there were 12 court cases with 15 charges; seven speeding, seven stop sign violations; one no license; fines imposed amounted to \$120.

10 Years Ago — July 1976

Townsman Publisher Irving E. Rogers announced the promotion of two Townsman staff members. Robert E. Finneran has been named editor and Michael A. Masessa, Jr. is now Advertising and Business Manager.

A Festival Service celebrating the 200th birthday of our nation will be held Sunday, July 4 at Cochran Chapel, Phillips Academy. This is an ecumenical, inter-faith service supported by all Andover churches and faiths and sponsored by the Bicentennial Committee.

As was anticipated, the termination of passenger train service to Andover in April was simply a prelude to the termination of the commuter special to the area. Lawrence and Haverhill have ended their subsidy payment for continued once-a-day service to the area and the final run to and from Boston took place Wednesday.

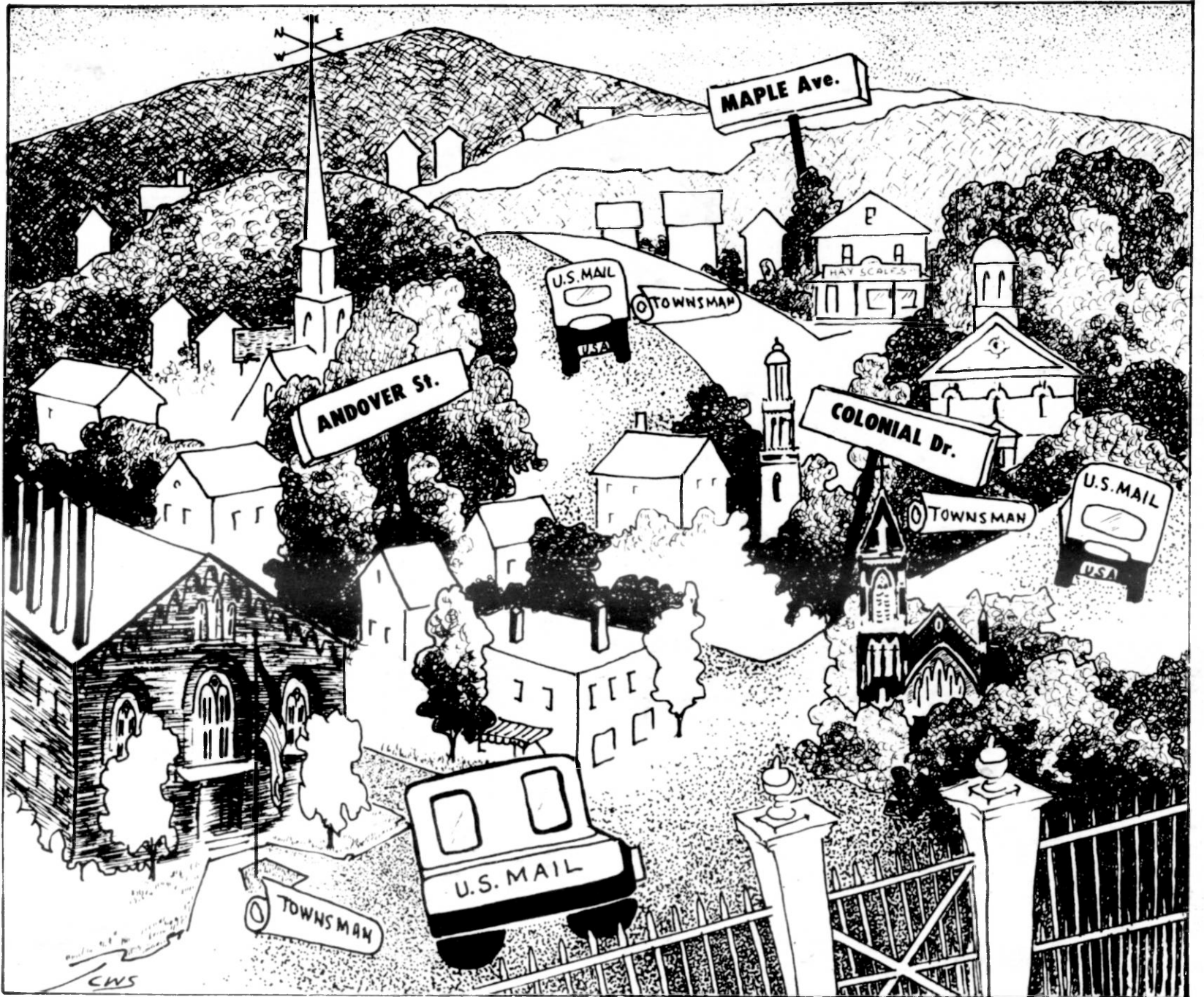

Gold In Tie For Top After Three Games On The Road

Defending Greater-Reading Pony League champion Andover Gold remained tied for first place in the East Division after posting a win, tie and loss in three road games last week.

Gold opened with a 7-3 victory over the North Reading Braves at North Reading High, battled Lynnfield to a 0-0 tie at the Kennedy School field, and dropped a 4-2 decision to the undefeated Stoneham Cubs at Stoneham High.

The split left Gold with a 2-1-1 overall record, and AG was scheduled for its fourth and fifth consecutive away games this week at the Reading Y's Men (Tuesday) and at the Wilmington Wildcats (Wednesday).

The locals are then idle over the holiday weekend, returning to action next Monday at Andover High against the visiting Reading Astros.

AG continued to receive strong pitching performances, last week from Barry Connors (1-hit shutout), Glenn Farnham, Scott Wallace and Mike Giammasi.

Andover Gold, 7-3

Righthanders Glenn Farnham (1-0) and Scott Wallace (two saves) combined for a six-hitter as Gold defeated last year's semifinal round playoff opponent North Reading.

Farnham worked four inning of four-hit ball, fanning three and walking four, while Wallace came through with three frames of two-hit, shut-out relief.

Gold grabbed a 3-0 lead in the top of the first when Andy Shea singled, advanced to third on an outfield error, and scored on Tom Murray's fielder's choice grounder that erased Wallace (walk) at second base.

Murray came across easily on a long triple by Chris Concemi, and Mark Tucker rescued Concemi with a suicide squeeze bunt.

North Reading bounced back with two in the home half, John Murphy clouting a long two-run double, but Gold netted the eventual game-winning run in the third as Shea walked and later raced home on an infield error.

AG added its final three runs in the fifth, Concemi belting a three-run homer after successive one-out walks to Wallace and Murray.

Brian Williamson's infield out plated the final Braves' tally in the fifth, but Wallace slammed the door thereafter for the second straight game.

Chris Lane added a double for Gold, Concemi finished 2-for-4 with four RBI, and Shea scored twice.

Farnham extricated himself from a big jam in the third inning, North Reading loading the bases with one down on a walk, single and error. He went to 3-0 on the next batter, then fired a strike before the hitter laced a sharp grounder to the mound resulting in a crisp 1-2-3 double-play (Farnham-Concemi-Tucker).

Concemi played a strong defensive game behind the plate, as did Wallace at shortstop and Shea at second base.

Gold-Lynnfield, 0-0

Righthander Barry Connors turned in a superb effort on the mound, firing a one-hit shut-out, whiffing nine and walking two.

He became stronger as the game progressed, retiring eight straight at one point and striking out four in the last two innings.

The performance went unrewarded, however, as Lynnfield (1-1-1) pitcher Jeff Walsh tossed a five-hit shutout himself.

Gold had a baserunner in six of the seven innings, but Walsh kept the ball low and walked only one batter to stay clear of serious trouble.

AG's top threat came in the fifth when Connors lashed a two-out double down the rightfield line. Andy Shea followed with a single to centerfield, but Connors was cut down trying to score on a fine throw from Lynnfield's Mike Grasso to catcher Dave Sampson.

Lynnfield had one strong bid in the bottom of the first, loading the bases after two outs on a pair of errors and a ground ball single to left by Steve George.

George's safety proved to be all that separated Connors from a no-hitter, and trouble was averted when catcher Chris Concemi rifled a throw to first base picking off Sampson.

Tom Murray went 2-for-2 to pace the Gold attack, while Andy Shea and Joe Lyons contributed singles.

Glenn Farnham played well in rightfield for AG.

Stoneham Cubs, 4-2

Both teams were undefeated coming into the contest, but Stoneham overcame an early 2-0 deficit to remain perfect at 4-0.

Mike Giammasi (1-1 overall) was the tough-luck loser, permitting six hits including a key bad-hop RBI single.

Gold had Cubs' hard-throwing righthander Brian Hilliard on the ropes in the first inning, but couldn't put him away. That proved fatal as Hilliard settled down to pitch a solid five-hit, seven-strikeout game.

Scott Wallace opened the contest with a walk, and then Mark Tucker beat out a bunt single with Wallace alertly racing to an uncovered third base. Tucker promptly stole second, and Tom Murray followed with a two-run single to centerfield.

Chris Concemi reached on an error, Murray taking third, and Concemi stole second to put two more in scoring position with no one out.

Hilliard retired the next batter on a tapper to the mound, fanned the next hitter after an unsuccessful suicide squeeze try, and escaped the inning on a groundout to short.

Stoneham retaliated with a run in the bottom

of the first, using a pair of singles to set up a first and third situation. The Cubs then worked a double steal, which Gold covered until the runner at third slid home and knocked the ball from the catcher's glove.

Stoneham tied it with an unearned run in the second, and grabbed the lead in the third when Jim O'Connell singled and Joe Sopokella drilled a long RBI triple to left-centerfield.

The insurance run came in the fifth as Hilliard doubled, took third after two walks, and scored on a sacrifice fly to rightfield (sliding under the throw).

Gold threatened in the sixth when Glenn Farnham slapped a two-strike single to centerfield and Chris Lane walked, but Hilliard worked free on a pair of infield pop-ups and a strikeout.

Mike Giammasi and Bill Batchelder added singles for Gold, while Wallace was again a defensive standout at shortstop.

Awarded Prize By Kennedy Library

Irene C. Crane, a teacher at Bancroft School in Andover and a resident of North Andover, has been awarded a \$250 prize by the John F. Kennedy Library for her work in teaching about state and local government and public affairs.

Crane developed a political awareness unit in state and local government for her sixth-grade students. The unit involved students in identifying and learning about their local and state leaders, developing and presenting opinions about current issues and understanding civic responsibility. As part of the unit activities, students conducted a public opinion survey of Andover citizens on the seat belt law, roadblocks to detect drunk drivers and the mandatory one-year jail sentence for unlawful possession of firearms. Each student was required to perform an act of citizen involvement in the community, such as tutoring a younger child, helping a senior citizen or cleaning up a neighborhood.

This project was established to recognize Massachusetts teachers for creative and effective classroom work and to support program and curriculum development on a variety of topics and issues in American government, politics and history.
