## No Trucks Ruling Relaxed Except For Clark Road

Monday night, the Board of Selectmen voted to re-establish truck access to all town roads except for Clark Road. The vote, which negated previous "no truck" rulings on such residential thruways as Lovejoy and Greenwood roads, was prompted by petitions from two separate groups of Andover residents who had felt aggrieved by the prohibitions.

Although they were served by a single solution, the problems of two petitioning groups—and the groups themselves—were distinctly different.

Safety concerns lay at the heart of the first petition, which was signed by 30 residents of High Plain Road. "Recently, 'No Trucks' signs have been posted for Lovejoy Road and Greenwood Road," began the text. "This has resulted in a

noticeable increase in truck traffic on High Plain Road."

The document further noted that the street has no sidewalks, and that it is heavily traveled by small children who walk to the nearby West Elementary School. The residents asked that the board also prohibit trucks on High Plain.

The second petition dealt with commerce. In its text, 13 individuals who own and/or operate businesses employing trucks charged that it was "unfair that agencies of the Town of Andover choose to bar the use of our vehicles on certain Town streets." The ban not only increased truck traffic on bordering roadways, said the document, but also

## Selectman Donn Byrne Dies Suddenly At 49

Selectman Donn B. Byrne, 49, 15 Lovejoy Road, died Monday night at Lawrence General Hospital.

He had been admitted for emergency surgery for a burst blood vessel in his abdomen Monday afternoon.

Byrne had served on the Finance Committee prior to his election to the Board of Selectmen five years ago, and continued to attend the Finance Committee meetings regularly.

"His contribution is hard to measure," said Town Manager Kenneth Mahony. "He guided us through (Proposition) Two-and-a-half...he has contributed immensely to my ability to operate."

Mahony added that "He knew the town operation and knew what had to be done." Commenting that Byrne was "a

person of great enthusiasms," Mahony also characterized Byrne as "a fiscal conservative, a voice of caution." Although he favored the renovations to the old town hall, Byrne expressed concern about how the cost of the project, \$2.3 million, would affect the town.

If a job needed to be done, Byrne would volunteer to do it. "Very dedicated to town meeting" he just last week spoke before the town meeting improvement committee. "He was a super person who will be badly missed," said Mahony.

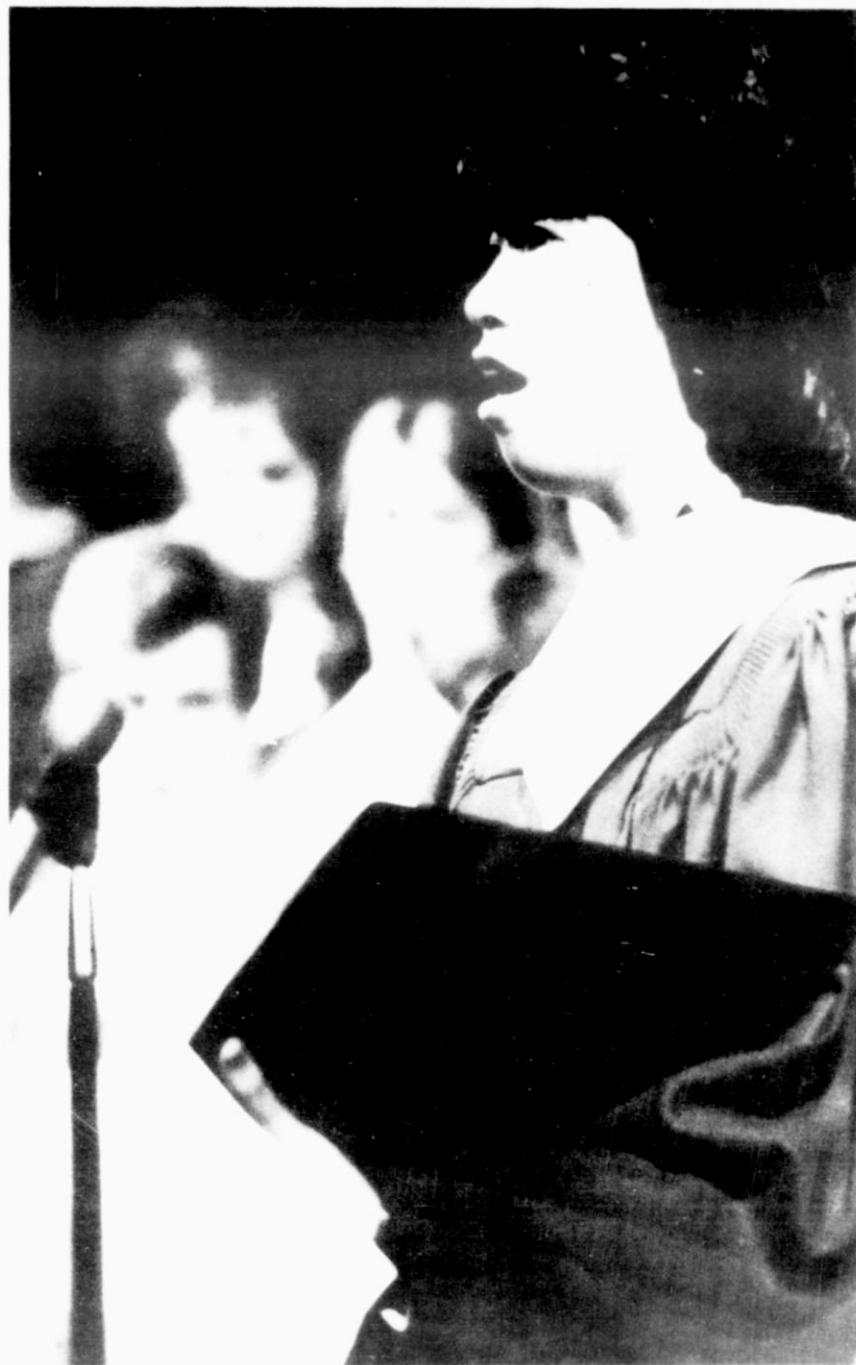

# Town House Topics

## To Interview Zoning Board Candidates

Monday night, the Andover Board of Selectmen agreed to interview the five residents who have applied for the seat that is vacant on the Zoning Board of Appeals. The interviews—which, said board members, will be open to the public—will be scheduled for 6:30 on Jan. 12 (prior to the regularly-scheduled 7:30 meeting) in the Town Hall third floor meeting room.

The selectmen also finalized the Eminent Domain Taking of three parcels of conservation land, owned by the Maksian, Boloian and Simpson families. Two of the parcels, the 22-acre Maksian and 52-acre Boloian

holdings, are located in the Chandler Road/Route 93 area and are crucial to the protection of the Fish Brook watershed. The third, the 10-acre Simpson parcel, will become an Andover piece of the "Emerald Necklace" of linked greenspaces planned for eastern Massachusetts. The \$500,000 in funding for the acquisition has been awarded in two equal amounts to the Patriot National Bank and State Street Bank, both of Boston.

Finally, the board voted to approve the installation of a pole on River Road by Mass. Electric Company and New England Telephone.

## School Program To Receive State Grant

Andover will receive \$5,300 in Early Childhood Education grants between this past October and next June, State Education Commissioner Ron Reynolds announced.

The early childhood education grants are to be used by districts "for developmentally-appropriate preschool, enhanced kindergarten,

day care, extended day and transitional kindergarten programs," said Reynolds, adding that "local councils and local needs assessments are required" for participation in the program.

The funding comes under the School Improvement Act of 1985, Chapter 188.

## Academy Hill Historic Certificates Available

By Barbara Thibault

The Andover Historical Society, 97 Main St., extends an invitation to all property owners in the Academy Hill Historic District to collect their National Register certificates, which are issued by the Massachusetts Historical Commission. National Register properties are distinguished by having been documented and evaluated for historical importance according to uniform standards. Listing in the National Register also qualifies the owner for federal tax incentives and other preservation assistance.

Academy Hill Historic District comprises most of Phillips Academy campus plus a small array of residential structures on School, Main, Wheeler and Highland Streets, including 160 buildings, walks, a tower, gates, a cemetery, a

pond and more than 450 acres. The "hill," as it is locally known, represents the landmarks of three separate educational institutions: Phillips Academy (1778), Andover Theological Seminary (1807) and Abbot Academy (1829). While Phillips Academy is recognized as the oldest American incorporated boarding school, none of the original wooden buildings survive. Bulfinch Hall, made of brick and named for the noted Boston architect, was built in 1819 as the third academy building and is the oldest surviving structure. Graves Hall, eclectic and ornate in its use of brick, is one of the few representative late 19th century masonry buildings extant in And-

over. In the early 20th century, a major development plan was executed after Phillips Academy acquired the Andover Theological Seminary buildings. New construction, like the Addison Art Gallery and Cochran Chapel, occurred, relocation of older structures such as the 1824 Samaritan and 1828 Stowe Houses resulted and major landscape renovations of the campus were carried out.

Though the institution of the Andover Theological Seminary has left the community, the lecture halls, dormitories and faculty homes remain. Foxcroft (1808), Pearson (1818) and Bartlett (1820) Halls reflect the utilitarian design of early institutional architecture and the federal style. Whereas the residence of the first seminary president, located at 189 Main St., represents a high style example of the federal period.

The School Street campus, formerly Abbot Academy, is a continuum of architecture between 1829 and 1921. Abbot Hall was originally erected facing School Street and retains its imposing presence with a two-story center pavilion supported by Ionic columns. The facades of Draper (1890) and McKeen (1904) Hall with irregular massing and arched openings, contrast the 1907 art gallery with its classical details and the scrolled metalwork of the 1921 Merrill Memorial Gateway. Equally important to the setting of the historic district is "The Grove," a wooded area to the rear of Abbot Circle laid out in the 19th century with paths, benches and a garden. Many of the buildings can be located by using "A Walking Tour of Phillips Academy" available at the Addison Art Gallery.

Along with the architectural and historical significance of the Academy Hill Historic District is the contributing importance of the persons associated with these institutions. The list reads like "Who's Who" in American history.

More information on districts and individual properties is available at the Historical Society's Underhill Research Library which is open Monday through Friday from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. The society and library will be closed from December 25-29. Please plan to pick up your certificate and have a tour of the Blanchard House at the same time. The house museum is open Sundays and Wednesdays between 2 p.m. and 4 p.m. or any day by appointment.

# Holiday Telephone Tips

Christmas Day is expected to be AT&T's busiest calling holiday. About 34.5 million long distance and international calls are anticipated to be handled over the company's network.

Here are some tips that can save time and money:

Dial directly. No matter what the hour, the price for a call dialed directly is lower than the price of the same call made with the help of an operator. Customers away from home should use their AT&T cards to save money over third-party billed and operator-assisted calls.

Try calling between 2 p.m. and 6 p.m. Christmas Day when calling volumes are traditionally at their lowest.

When planning international calls, check telephone directory to make sure you can dial the call yourself. Most customers can dial to 146 for-

eign countries and territories. However, callers who live in areas without direct-dial service still can make calls at the direct-dial rate by calling an AT&T long-distance operator.

Take advantage of the 56 percent discount on calls placed between 11 p.m. Wednesday, Dec. 24, and 8 a.m. Christmas Day. AT&T prices are discounted 40 percent on Christmas between 8 a.m. and 11 p.m. After 11 p.m. and until 8 a.m. Friday, Dec. 26, the 56 percent discount will again be in effect.

Of the total 34.5 million calls estimated on Christmas Day, AT&T says 23.8 million will be state-to-state long distance connections, 7.9 million will be within states and the remaining 2.8 million will be placed to many of the more than 250 countries and territories linked to the AT&T network.

## Endangered

The roseate tern, a dove-sized coastal seabird with a black cap and long forked tail, has been proposed for addition to the U.S. List of Endangered and Threatened Species by the Interior Department's U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service.

The proposed rule would classify the population that nests in northeastern North America (primarily from Maine to New York) as endangered. The primary causes for the roseate tern's decline are displacement from suitable nesting islands by expanding numbers of Herring and Black Backed Gulls, human activity and predation.

A strong flier that feeds mainly on small fish, which it catches by plunging headfirst into the water, the roseate tern nests on the ground, usually on small islands. It gradually migrates very long distances in mid-to-late summer to its wintering areas in the waters off northern South America from the Pacific coast of Colombia to eastern Brazil.

In 1986, nesting was known to have occurred only in Connecticut, Maine, Massachusetts, New York and Florida, plus a few pairs in adjacent areas in the provinces of Nova Scotia and Quebec.

Falk is also an advisor to the U.S. Department of Agriculture, National Plant Germplasm System Operations Committee.

## Four Petitions By Hotel Group To Be Heard By Appeals Board

Four of the eleven petitions to be heard by the Zoning Board of Appeals at their next meeting were submitted by three separate organizations in relation to property on Old River Road. The Zoning Board of Appeals will hear the petitions at a public hearing to be held Thursday, Jan. 8, at 6:30 p.m. in the School Committee conference room, second floor of the School building, Whittier St. entrance.

Two petitions have been submitted in reference to the Andover Marriott Hotel which is being constructed at 123 Old River Road.

The first petition, by Spectradyne, Inc. of Richardson, Texas, is requesting a special permit to allow the installation of a television receiving dish on the hotel premises. Ocean Properties North is asking for a variance to allow a sign

which will not be oriented to a street on which the hotel has access.

In relation to vacant land with frontage on Old River Road, The Andover Companies have submitted two petitions. The first is as a party aggrieved by a decision of the building inspector in regard to the height of the building they have planned for the sight. Their second petition is a request for a variance to construct the building, which exceeds height restrictions in the zoning by-law.

Arthur Williams, 23 Enfield Drive, is petitioning the board to allow construction of a dwelling at 186 High St. and vacant land on High St. The dwelling will not meet minimum setback requirements. According to the application, to build within the setbacks, the home would encroach on the wetlands.

A special permit to convert a two-fami-

ly home to a three-family home has been requested by P. & S. Realty Trust for property at 8-10 Florence St. According to the petition, trustees Sheila M. Doherty and Patrick J. McLaughlin hope to create affordable housing and make the property economically feasible by increasing the property value. Although the town will lose one parking space, the petitioner will create three or four others.

Roman Y. Gonzales, 123 Haverhill St., is petitioning to allow an addition that will not increase the non-conforming nature of the dwelling. The building inspector denied Gonzales a building permit, and he wants the board to review the decision.

Allowance of a division of a single lot located at 44 Vine St., in a Single Residence C district, has been requested by

Gary M. Costello and Elizabeth K. Costello. Frontage of 180 feet is required for the district, and if the Costello's divide the property, one of the lots will be 4.23 feet short of that requirement.

John Vetrano, 32 Andover St., has petitioned the board for continued operation of an establishment at 38-40 Andover St., where the principal activity is the sale of food or drink for consumption on or off the premises. He has also requested modification of previous board decisions #1649 and #1789.

A request for a variance to allow a reduction in the number of parking spaces required has been submitted by The South Church of Andover, Inc.

A special permit for the construction of an in-law apartment at 44 River Road had been requested by Sebastiano J. and Regina M. Messina, for the care of a parent.

## He Provided The Spirit Of Christmas

Time was short. I had stayed at the office too long; back at my dirty and disordered home, my in-laws were due to arrive any minute.

So I was not filled with good cheer when the editor handed me a photo that had been taken last year. I was, he said, to track down the fellow in the picture and get information for a small article about him.

Oh, joy, I thought as I trudged up to the door of the man's house. With all this work, when was I going to get time for Christmas?

Maybe, I prayed, he wouldn't be home.

But he was.

As it turned out, it was fortunate for me that he was. If I'd rushed off to orchestrate my holiday and missed Harold Livingston, I would have passed up a very real, and rare, little ray of what Christmas is all about.

Harold Livingston's slight frame is stooped beneath the weight of his 87 years. He wears hearing aids in both ears. He's not an educated man, in the high-school-and-college sense.

What Livingston is, rather, is a cross between an elf and Santa Claus. He is a craftsman and a giver and, in the mix, a truly decent person.

Ten years ago, Fr. Tom Walsh of Merrimack College noted that the creche that housed the nativity figures for the chapel's Christmas display was in disrepair. So he asked Livingston, a retired man who had been "handy" about the campus, if he would make a replacement.

Livingston—neither a Catholic nor a Merrimack alumnus—agreed to help.

Now, you or I might have knocked a few planks together with nails and called the job done. Not Livingston.

After consulting a book on religious symbolism, obtained through the Masons (he had been a member for a half-century), he decided to make the stable of cedar—a "spiritual" wood of great significance in the bible.

The infant's crib, he decided, would be crafted of acacia, the non-rotting wood from which the biblical Ark of the Covenant was constructed.

Acacia grows in the tropics, not in Massachusetts. Livingston, however, had been a florist for 45 years prior to his retirement in 1962. He had grown his own acacia tree in his greenhouse.

Livingston pattered in his cellar workshop for two weeks on the project, working the logs with a table saw, a hand saw, and, when necessary, a chainsaw. When he finished it, the stable measured approximately six by four by three feet.

"I'm not like the fellow who built the boat, and it was too big to get out of the cellar," he told me. "I made it collapsible, so it could be put together with eye hooks." One or two people can set the creche up in fifteen minutes.

The stable stands at Merrimack College today. In it, the infant rests in a cradle hewn of wood from Livingston's acacia tree.

In the living room of his little house on Abbot Street, the old man showed me pictures of the stable. And of other projects he had made and given to others.

He showed me the furniture he had made—beautiful pieces in his own home.

Harold Livingston told me that he doesn't make many things now; the eyes that twinkle with such good humor behind the rimless spectacles are, he says, pretty poor for such pro-

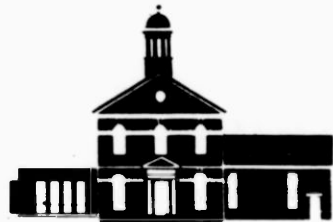

## Warriors In First Place Chinese Next On Agenda

The Warriors didn't beat the Lowell Chiefs in two tries, losing the season-opener by a goal and then dropping a re-match at the Volpe Complex by a deceiving 6-4 margin, but, there's nothing else to be glum about in summarizing the Merrimack College's hockey team's first-semester performance.

The Warriors went into exams with a 10-3 record, including a perfect 9-0 slate in ECAC II play that put them at the top of the ECAC East standings. They played in three tournaments, won two and shutout 1984 NCAA Division I national champion RPI in the consolation final of the other one. They out-scored the opposition 31-9 in the third period.

"I'm very happy," fourth-year head coach Ron Anderson reported as he began preparations for an exhibition game against the Chinese National team at Harvard on December 27. "I felt going into the year we had the potential to have a good season. Our record is a little better than I expected it to be at this point."

Merrimack's perfect divisional slate includes wins over ECAC II powers Babson (6-4), Plattsburgh State (6-3) in the finals of Plattsburgh's own tournament and Salem State (7-2), a semester-closing skirmish in Salem that

snapped a five-year Merrimack losing streak in Salem's Rockett Arena.

The win at Salem State was very big, particularly when you consider Merrimack's scoring at Rockett Arena in the previous two years equalled no goals in 120 minutes of hockey. The win also marked the return of junior Jim Vesey, an All-America last season who scored 61 points. The burly forward scored two goals and assisted on two others to finish the semester with 10 goals and 11 assists for 21 points.

Vesey's point total was second to that of sophomore forward Richard Pion who had 14 goals and 9 assists for 23 points. The speedy right wing proved he is a sound defensive forward as well as an explosive offensive threat as Division I Ferris State found out in the first round of the RPI Tournament when Pion notched his first collegiate hat trick. The Warriors squandered a 4-2 lead and lost on a last-minute goal. But they subsequently shutout RPI in the consolation game.

A third-round draft pick of the Washington Capitals in June, sophomore goalie Jim Hrivnak stopped 36 shots to shutout the Engineers. Just five days earlier he recorded his first collegiate

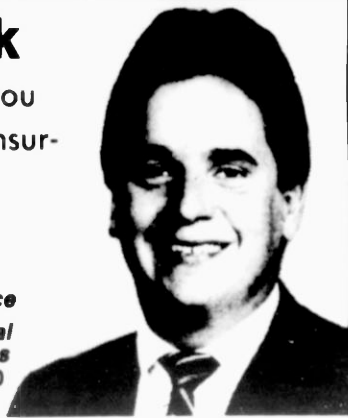



## Paedeia Seminar A Success

A group of 18 seventh-graders at Doherty Junior High School participated in the first Paedeia seminar held at the school on Friday, Dec. 12. The students were chosen by a random sampling from among a larger group who were all available for a solid 90-minute block of uninterrupted time. About ten days in advance of the seminar, the students assembled with Principal Dr. Richard McGrail, Vice Principal John Hughes and Paedeia Seminar Leader Douglas Halsted to talk about the procedures and receive copies of "The Little Prince" by Antoine de Saint Exupery, the book to be discussed.

The seminar started with a lively discussion about the participants' interpretations of the author's opinions concerning grown-ups and children. There followed questions about the roles and responsibilities of children and adults in general and in today's society in Andover in particular. The discussion then turned to the question, "Who was the Little Prince?" Some felt he was a Christ symbol, others felt he was a symbol of the child in everyone or in Saint Exupery. The seminar ended in a round-robin discussion of the character (other than the little prince) each participant most sympathized with, pitied or despised.

After the discussion about five minutes was spent evaluating the seminar. A Paedeia seminar is defined as successful if three criteria are met: 1. the participants end with an enlarged understanding of the material; 2. they leave with greater insights; 3. they still have questions at the end.

The participants agreed that these criteria were met. Many said they had gained new and different feelings about "The Little Prince" because of their exposure to others' opinions. Some said they enjoyed expressing themselves freely, without feeling that there were any right or wrong answers. They revelled in the fact that they were not graded on what they said or felt.

McGrail, Hughes and Halsted were pleased with this first Paedeia seminar at Doherty. They look forward to more seminars of a similar nature with different students discussing different books.

## Gillette Announces Plan To Increase Profitability

The Gillette Company announced that its board of directors has approved a restructuring plan and a series of actions designed to increase cash flow and accelerate earnings growth in 1987 and beyond. The steps will result in a one-time, pre-tax charge to earnings in the fourth quarter of 1986 of approximately \$190 million.

The charge is expected to result in the company reporting a substantial loss in the fourth quarter, but it will report a profit for the full year 1986.

An analysis of all aspects of the company's businesses is under way with the objective of downsizing or, if appropriate, consolidating operations. In anticipation of these actions, a reduction of about 2,400 people, or 8 percent of the company's worldwide work force, will occur through retirements, attrition and employee severance plans for all staff and operating units. The majority of these reductions will be completed within the next three months.

Additional measures will include selling or discontinuing several small business units, phasing out investment in oil and gas properties and selling several real estate properties.

"These actions, when coupled with long-standing programs of strict control over product costs, overhead expenses and working capital, should accelerate the previously planned rate of profit increase for the future, while assuring vitality in major existing product lines. The cumulative impact of these efforts is directed towards maximizing stockholder value," said Colman M. Mockler, Jr., chairman and chief executive officer.

The board has authorized, depending upon market conditions and other factors, the purchase of up to 7 million

shares of stock from time to time in the open market or in privately negotiated transactions. The company has begun making purchases under this authorization.

The board of directors declared the regular quarterly dividend of 34 cents per share payable March 5, 1987, to stockholders of record on February 2, 1987.

decreased the efficiency of local businesses and shifted the resulting burden of increased operating costs to the consumers.

Town Manager Kenneth Mahony explained to the petitioners that the truck prohibitions had originally been set in place as an experiment, an attempt to improve the safety of the narrow rural-type roads. Unfortunately, he said, the experiment had failed because truck drivers had sought alternate and, as it turned out, equally unsuitable routes.

"My experience with this truck traffic is that, every time you make a move...you don't eliminate the problem—you shift it," he said. "It's sort of like bubble gum, when you use it to plug up a leak—the water just comes out all over the place."

The real answer to High Plain Road's problems, he said, would be to widen and straighten the street and build sidewalks. He added that, although there was little he could do to change it, he

sympathized with the residents' plight. "It's tough to say to your children, 'You can't play in the front yard unless you learn to stay away from the traffic,'" he said.

Mahony urged the board to except Clark Road from their lifting of the truck ban. That prohibition was effected to channel traffic through Lowell Junction, he explained; trucks do not have to use the road because they can use an alternate exit from Route 93.

Mahony added that the state had agreed some time ago to post signs on the highway directing trucks to exit at the appropriate road. As is often the case with state projects, he said, the signs were not yet in place—even though he had offered to paint them himself if they would install them.

Selectman Gerry Silverman told the business petitioners that the town had never intended the ban to inhibit locally-based commerce.

**EMINENT DOMAIN**


If your town or city wants to build a highway and your home is in the way, can it take your property without your consent? The answer is yes! It can do it by the power of eminent domain. This is the right of the government to take private property for public use with just compensation paid to the private property owner.

Usually, when a town considers taking a property, it will hire an appraiser to determine value. The town will then offer the owner this appraised price for the property. If this amount is not acceptable to the owner, he or she has the right to recourse in court to challenge the price but not the taking. If not satisfied, the owner may appeal this price decision.

The term condemnation refers to the power of the government to take private property for public use or benefit. The government does not need the property owner's consent. Again, under condemnation proceedings, the property owner is entitled to a fair price for the property.



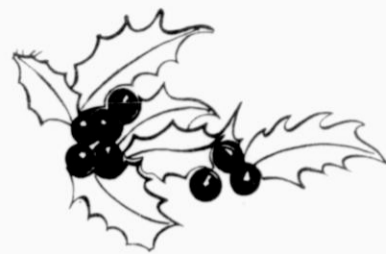
