## Planners Approve Development Of 285 Rental Units

Tuesday night, the Planning Board gave its blessing to site plans for the development of 285 units of rental housing off River Road. The project's developers have applied for a Comprehensive Permit for the project, which, if approved by the Zoning Board of Appeals, will abut land earmarked for use by Emerson College in its planned move to Lawrence.

The Planning Board approval is advisory and non-binding, and was sought by the ZBA, which is the sole town board to rule on Comprehensive Permits, as input for its eventual decision.

According to Paul Donnelly, project architect for the Corcoran Co. developers, "Riverview Commons" is planned for a 22-acre parcel at the rear of the Andover Business Park industrial subdivision off River Road. The project would comprise five buildings of five stories each.

Each building, said Donnelly, would contain three three-bedroom units, 29 single-bedroom units, 20 two-bedroom units, and five studios. Three units per building would be fully accessible to handicapped residents. All units would be rental apartments.

Four of the buildings would be clustered at the end of a cul-de-sac and overlooking a center green; the fifth would be separated from the others by wetlands. There would be a clubhouse, tennis

courts, a pool, and a maintenance building on the grounds.

Corcoran Co. representative Bill Moore said that the site would be served by sewer and by water from Lawrence. The development would cover less ground than an industrial park originally planned for the parcel, he said. Furthermore, he added, although it would infringe on the 100-foot wetlands buffer, it would not do so to the extent anticipated for that industrial development.

Moore said that the parcel sits on the Lawrence city line; the land on the other side had been targeted for eminent

## Rabies Clinic Scheduled At Junior High

The Town of Andover's annual Rabies Clinic for dogs and cats will be held Saturday, April 25, from 8:30 a.m. to 12 noon at West Junior High School, Shawsheen Road. The clinic is sponsored by the Andover Board of Health, Andover Animal Hospital and West Parish Boy Scout Troop 77.

Massachusetts law requires that vaccine be given to puppies at three to six months of age and repeated after one year. Thereafter, dogs

must be vaccinated every three years. Cats should also be immunized according to the above schedule.

Transport cats in a cage, box or pillow case. Dogs should have a choke collar and sturdy leash.

The price for each animal is \$6.

A Rabies Clinic will be held in Lawrence on May 2 at Webster's Blue Seal, 32 West St., from 8:30 a.m. to 12 noon.

## Glass Drive Will Be This Saturday

This Saturday, April 18, even if there's rain, snow, sleet, hail, a sudden heat wave or an eclipse, reliable Andover Recycling, Inc. volunteers will be on duty from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. at the town's monthly glass drive. The glass collection bin will be

placed at the inner end of the town hall parking lot on Bartlet Street, next to the park. Only clear and green glass bottles and jars will be recycled. They must be placed in clearly marked sections of the bin according to color.

## Recycling Has Saved \$14,000

After the expected winter drop in Andover's recycled paper tonnage, March figures show a substantial increase to 110.39 tons. At a conservative average tipping fee of \$55 per

ton, that paper disposed of as trash at the North Andover RESCO plant would have cost the town more than \$6,000. Recycling has saved Andover more than \$14,000 for the first quarter of 1987.

## To Lecture At Collins Center



David Elkind

David Elkind, well-known author of "The Hurried Child: Growing Up Too Fast too Soon" and "All Grown Up and No Place to go: Teenagers in Crises" will speak at the Collins Center on Tuesday, April 28, at 7:30 p.m.

Elkind is professor of child study and resident scholar at the Lincoln Filene Center at Tufts University. His research has been in perceptual, cognitive and social development and his articles have appeared in *The New York Times Magazine*, *Parents' Magazine*, *Psychology Today*, *Parade* and *Woman's Day*. He lectures in the United States, Canada and abroad and has appeared on "Today," "CBS Morning News," "20/20" and "Donahue." A new book entitled "The Miseducation of Children: Superkids at Risk" is forthcoming.

This lecture is made possible through the joint efforts of the Andover Public Schools, Parent Advisory Groups and the Andover Business Collaborative. Funding has been provided by a grant from The Smith Purdon Fund at West Parish Church.

Elkind's lecture will be followed by a month-long, community-wide effort called "A.S.K. (Assessment, Support and Knowledge) for Alternatives during which businesses, individuals, schools and church and civic groups will be asked to participate in activities focusing on ways to work together toward a healthier, more supportive environment for young people.

## Summer Program Offered Special Needs Children

The Department of Community Services will offer the Pennacook Park summer program for children with developmental disabilities, ages 3-22, beginning Monday, July 6.

In its second year, the program promises the children five fun-filled weeks of sports and athletics (including swimming), crafts, field trips, academics, cookouts and more. Pennacook Park is held on the grounds of Phillips Academy.

Staff members Toniann Rougier and Patrick Hamilton will return. The main goal of the program is to provide instruction and support in order that participants may enjoy more creative, fulfilling use of their free time during the summer.

Pennacook Park will run through Friday, Aug. 7, from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m. Monday through Friday. Children may register for the first session (July 6-17) or the second session (July 20-August 7) or combine the two sessions. Last summer trans-

portation was arranged by the school department's pupil personnel department and funded by the Margaret G. Towle fund. Transportation for Andover resident this summer is pending.

## Dr. Egmont Appointed Director

The Boston Food Bank announces the appointment of Westy A. Egmont as the new executive director. He will administer the agency and work at 70 Amory St., where the food bank has grown to be the primary link between more than 200 corporations donating edible but unmarketable food and more than 360 organizations which feed the needy in eastern Massachusetts.

"The opportunity to redistribute goods, reducing the 20 percent waste factor in our American food system and get that food to responsible pantries, soup kitchens, day care facilities, detoxification centers and shelters is a challenge and privilege," Egmont comments.

The Boston Food Bank operates out of a 23,000 sq.ft. warehouse in Roxbury where the agencies come to pick up the foods. A shared contribution system distributes the handling costs between the BFB and its related agencies. Annual donations sustain the facility and program. The BFB aims to distribute more than 4 million pounds of food this year. "A major challenge we face is to glean the salvage of the supermarkets," Egmont said. Food pantries particularly seek canned vegetables and soups, but the industry seldom donates primary foods in cans. Volunteers sort the food salvage.

Boston Food Bank is associated with Second Harvest, the national network of food banks which numbers 78 and procures food donations from the major national producers as well as maintaining food bank standards and resources.

Dr. Egmont previously served as senior pastor of South Church in Andover. Known in the Lawrence area for his community concern, he helped found Covenant Housing, a non-profit housing corporation, worked as chairman of Hospice with the local VNA and served as a trustee at Gordon College. Egmont served the church during a time of revitalization as the membership grew and the buildings were entirely renovated. For seven seasons he has hosted a 7:30 a.m. Sunday talk show on WBZ-TV 4.

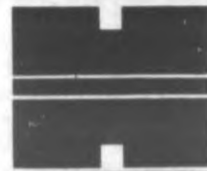

## Math Team On Winning Streak

Fifteen seventh and eighth grade students from Doherty Junior High School traveled to Chelmsford on Thursday, March 26, and attempted to solve such problems as: "By how much does  $62\frac{1}{2}$  percent of the product of 45 and  $3\frac{1}{5}$  exceed the cube of three?" and "Simplify completely:  $(14+6) + 16 \times 2 - (63 - (19+4) 45 - 9 \cdot 3^2$ ." Their diligent preparation paid off as they successfully answered these and many other challenging questions in a short time period. Doherty again placed first in this fifth meet of the Intermediate

Math League of Mass. competitions.

The team was captained by Mike Robinson who assisted in leading several team practices prior to this competition. Outstanding performances were also given by Greg DeBeer, Allen Soong and Peter Tavernini. An outstanding perfect score was achieved on the team questions portion of the meet. The purpose of the program was to introduce young women to a variety of careers in mathematics and related sciences. 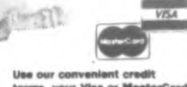

The Town of Andover's Annual Rabies Clinic for dogs and cats will be held on Saturday, April 25, from 8:30 a.m. to noon at the West Junior High School, Shawsheen Road.

This year, the event has been organized by Gary Rollins of Boy Scout Troop 77, West Parish Church, in conjunction with Dr. Richard Lindsey of Andover Animal Hospital. Rollins is coordinating the clinic as a community project, a step toward his attainment of the rank of Eagle Scout.

Massachusetts law requires that vaccine be given to puppies and kittens at three to six months of age and repeated after one year. Thereafter, the pets must be vaccinated every three years.

Pet owners should transport cats to the clinic in a cage, box or pillowcase, and keep dogs on a choke collar and sturdy leash. The price for each immunization will be six dollars.

In addition to Troop 77 and the Andover Ani-

mal Hospital, the clinic is also sponsored by the Andover Board of Health and the Lawrence Pet Control officer.

A Rabies Clinic will also be held in Lawrence, at H.K. Webster Co.—Blue Seal Feeds, 32 West St., from 8:30 a.m. until noon on May 2.

## Balloon Rally To Highlight Open House

Hot air balloons, kite flying stunts, a craft fair and flea market and jazz bands will be among the highlights of a day-long open house at Northern Essex Community College, Haverhill, on Saturday, May 2.

'The Sky's the Limit at Northern Essex' is the theme for the events which will kick-off with the launching of 10 hot air balloons shortly after dawn.

The day will feature activities for the entire family as well as on-the-spot registration for summer and fall classes.

Among the events will be a kite-making workshop, classroom demonstrations and displays, lift-off pancake breakfast, international foods, a Kiwanis bike rodeo and photography contest.

Professional kite-flyers will perform kite-flying stunts and demonstrate a number of unique kites, including a five-foot-high, three-dimensional kite shaped like a clipper ship.

Cultural events will include performances by Still Point Dance, the New England Conservatory Brass Quintet, the 12-piece Caribbean band La Gran Familia, drama presentations, a festival of high school jazz bands and The Souls, a popular local rock band. There will be an afternoon karate display and demonstration.

All events will be free. There will be a charge for food and other purchases.

To acquaint visitors with special educational opportunities and classroom facilities, a number of faculty representing academic and continuing education programs and courses will put on demonstrations and answer questions.

The hot air balloons will take off around 7 a.m. and again about 5 p.m., according to Ed Lappies, the balloonmeister who will coordinate the flights.

"You'll have to be an early riser to see the morning launch," he said. Balloon flights are regulated by the Federal Aviation Administration which only permits the balloons to be in the air for three hours after sunrise and three hours before sunset. Early risers can attend a pancake breakfast after the lift off and before participating in the rest of the day's events.

All balloons will be flown by licensed pilots. Local businesses will help subsidize the open house by sponsoring individual balloons and there will be a raffle for one balloon ride.

The balloons will not take off if it is raining or too windy, according to Lappies. The final decision is determined by the balloonists' safety officers. All other events, except the kite flying, will be held rain or shine.

Present and prospective students interested in enrolling for summer and fall credit and non-credit courses will be able to do so during the open house. Representatives from the financial aid and admissions offices will be available.

There is plenty of free parking on campus and buses will take people without transportation from Central Catholic High School in Lawrence to the college. Northern Essex is located just off Route 495, exit 52.

# Computer Plan Approved

At last Tuesday night's session of Town Meeting, the Andover school department won its bid to bring town children into the high-tech age with a comprehensive computer plan. Residents approved the \$1,500,000 article—for a phased five-year plan that will include the purchase and installation of computer hardware and software, and will fund specialized staff training—by a vote of 455 to 50.

The victory followed on the heels of a defeat—the Monday night vote to limit the 1988 school budget increase to seven percent. The School Committee had asked for an eight percent increase, charging that the additional funding was necessary to maintain the town's quality of education at its present level.

In his presentation of the computer plan, School Committee member David Birnbach cited data that compared Andover's student-to-computer ratio (1:69 at the elementary level; 1:30 at secondary) with those of systems in Lexington (1:25 and 1:13, respectively) and Lawrence (1:16 and 1:14). Andover's goal after five years would be a ratio of 1:6 on all levels, he said.

Through the prospective program, said Birnbach, Andover students would learn to understand computers and how they process data and solve personal, business and scientific problems. They would learn how to access, manipulate and store information by using the machines.

Birnbach added that the program's progress would be monitored by an external advisory committee, and by the School Committee—which would have to approve each component of the plan—and would be summarized in the School Committee's annual report.

In order to get the best price on the equipment, said Birnbach, requests for proposals would be sent to all area vendors.

Stinson Road resident William Coderre questioned the five-year life of the plan, given that, he said, "In terms of the computer industry, two years is like a generation."

Birnbach explained that, in order to deal with potential vendors, the school department needed a commitment "up front," after which it would be able to build the program step by step over time.

"And you'll bond the entire amount at one time?" asked Coderre.

Town Manager Kenneth Mahony said that the details of the bonding—and even the necessity of bonding the program—were yet to be determined.

Coderre persisted. "You feel confident that

you know the economic picture for the next year?" he asked Mahony.

"Yes," said the Town Manager.

"I think that's a little more bravado than intelligence," said Coderre.

Coderre charged that, while he had no problem with a well-laid-out plan, he had seen nothing about the school's plans in the local media. He said he would have welcomed a broadly-based comparison of Andover to other communities in regards to computer situations. "However, I don't think a selected presentation aid that shows three communities is reasonable."

Former School Committee member Michael Giamusso explained that the plan was shaped during the committee's regularly-scheduled meetings. "It was at public sessions; they are on cable T.V.," he said. "There are no secrets here—it's very well documented and very well researched."

Giamusso added, "At times, you hear people up here say, 'trust us.' I guess that's what you have to do."

York Street resident Bob Wescott voiced a plea for more emphasis to be placed by the schools on basic skills and citizenship—qualities he, as an owner of a small business, has found lacking in local youth. "I submit to the committee that computers are not going to solve that problem," he said.

Selectman John Scileppi agreed that liberal arts and the humanities are important in education, but added that students who are not adequately prepared in computer sciences graduate "light-years behind."

The school system also won approval for funding of a master plan—an appropriation placed at \$25,000—by a vote of 320 to 208.

Tuesday night's assembly also approved a \$1,000,000 appropriation for land acquisitions, and authorized nine such acquisitions—including a parcel of land located between Elm, Pine, and Summer streets and Washington Avenue. The parcel had been considered previously for development by Paul Bruk under Comprehensive Permit.

## Quorum Questioned But Vote Holds On Town Buying Land

Proponents of the first of two articles that would pave the way for town-monitored building of low-cost housing held their collective breath at last Wednesday night's Town Meeting session, when an opponent called for a quorum count during the vote. It was close, but the count numbered the resident crowd at 356—six more than the required quorum of 350—and the article passed handily, 257 to 48. Article 65 requested authorization to

acquire, or to take by eminent domain, a total of 60.8 acres of land located between Route 93 and the Tewksbury town line for potential affordable housing development. Selectman William Dalton explained that the town has proposed the development in order to boost its affordable housing ratio beyond 10 percent of its total housing stock. If the ratio falls below that figure—as it now does—the state allows developers to build lower-

cost housing through a Comprehensive Permit, which disregards the effects of local zoning regulations.

Andover now has at least eight Comprehensive Permits pending, said Dalton. "I think it's safe to say that Comp Permits have not met with vast public acclaim," he said.

He added that the property specified in Article 65, and in a following similar article, would not provide the perfect location for affordable housing; there was, in fact, no perfect location. However, he maintained, the parcels were suitable for building and acceptable to the town and surrounding communities, and they would be targeted for private development under Comprehensive Permit in the event that the articles should fail to pass.

Town Manager Kenneth Mahony said that the town would not actually buy the land, but that it would use the power of eminent domain to ensure that it was bought by a developer who would agree to build only affordable housing to the

town's specifications. Of those specifications, he said, "We're not talking about Columbia Point." The condominiums would be owned by those who lived in them, he said, and would appeal to such people as the elderly, first-time home buyers, and town police officers and firefighters—"people," he said, "like you and me."

Mahony estimated that the units would be built at an average density of four or five per acre, and that plans would allow for a substantial amount of open space.

Asked if there would be developers who would be willing to develop land bordering the flood-swollen Shawsheen River, such as that offered in the second housing article, Mahony said, "Believe me, there are developers—there are developers who would do the bottom of the Shawsheen River." Under town-monitored planning, he added, the river banks would remain free of devel-

## North Street, River Road Development Is Proposed

Winn Development of Boston has recently filed the second largest comprehensive permit proposal yet in Andover, for 36.41 acres of open space at 120 North St., with frontage on both North St. and River Road. This development is across North St. from the Northwoods comprehensive permit development petition currently being heard by the Zoning Board of Appeals for 48 units on 4.85 acres.

The largest proposal submitted thus far is for Riverview Commons, consisting of 285 rental units on 22.4 acres with frontage on Andover Business Park Drive. Town Planner Stephen Colyer expects that two other proposals, one for 78 units on six acres with frontage on Sparkle Drive and the other for 150 units on five acres along Dale St., will be submitted in the next week or so.

Winn Development is proposing 241 units spread among 22 buildings, with an additional building to house a community center which will include a daycare center.

Twenty-one of the buildings will be two, three or four-story townhouse units attached to a three-story block of six flats with a common entranceway. A total of 193 family units, both affordable

and market rate, will be contained in these buildings. It is expected that the outer townhouse units will be those sold at market rate. The final housing building will be five stories, to allow an elevator, and will accommodate 48 elderly housing units.

Elderly units will be broken down to include equal numbers of one and two-bedroom units, 24 of each. The remaining subsidized units will consist of 48 two-bedroom family units, for a total of 96 "low-to-moderate-income" units.

Market rate units will be broken down into 78 two-bedroom family units and 67 three-bedroom units.

In addition to the community center, other recreational facilities include a pool and tennis court. Parking will consist of 461 spaces arranged in "pods", rather than one large parking area, amounting to two spaces per family unit, one space per elderly unit, and one visitor space for every nine units.

Although, overall, it is one of the largest plans yet, it is one of the lowest density proposals to date. Roads and parking areas will consume 14 percent of the total square footage and buildings will cover only 7.7 percent of the property, averaging out to a density of about six units per acre.

# Town Will Have Fourth Fireworks

Board of Selectmen Chairman Gerry Silverman received a great, big gift from Wednesday's Town Meeting assembly.

Since last summer, Silverman has waged a private campaign for contributions to light up Andover's skies on July 4. His trademark white-paper-covered coffee cans, the plastic tops slit to accommodate coins and bills, have turned up next to cash registers in most downtown businesses; they have attended Selectmen's meetings more faithfully than many members of the board.

Wednesday night, after debate that ranged from the grandiose to the grumpy, the assembly voted to pass Article 41—effectively appropriating a sum not to exceed \$8,500 for this coming Fourth's pyrotechnical display.

The Finance Committee had recommended disapproval of the article. "By now, you must know it's time for a bah-humbug speech from the FinCom," began Finance Committee member Rusty Dunbar, to the laughter of the crowd. She shook her head, musing, "All these little boys grow up and have to have fireworks."

Dunbar reiterated the committee's desire to protect the town's "free cash." By spending money on fireworks, she explained, the town would be setting a skewed priority—taking funds from

more worthy projects, like the buying of school books or the repair of roads ("And I know *what* roads," she added).

Resident Paul Cronin leapt to the article's defense. Billing himself as "one of those little boys who grow up and want fireworks," Cronin said that pyrotechnics constituted a noble tradition in America, one championed by George Washington and Thomas Jefferson—both of whom, he maintained, were known to have *made* fireworks.

Washington had urged citizens to celebrate their freedom with displays of fireworks, said Cronin. "I really think it's a duty of government to remind its citizens how that freedom came about," he declared.

To Dunbar, he added that the money would not divert funding from roads—"not even from books; we both know that." Rather, the money was a contingency, in case Silverman couldn't raise the required amount by donations before it was needed.

Dunbar countered that Andover had once had fireworks, but had stopped because of a "rather serious accident," which had cost the town a liability insurance settlement.

Ultimately, flash won over cash, and the article passed overwhelmingly by a show of hands.

Parents can serve the comfort of pedestrians, particularly on Main St., if they will warn their bicycle riding sons and daughters that such riding on the sidewalks is forbidden by law, because it is dangerous to the people for whom the sidewalks are maintained.

Superintendent of Streets Smith is doing some excellent work in street cleaning. It is good to see this preliminary spring endeavor accomplishing so much along the lines of a more cleanly Andover.

### 50 Years Ago — April 1937

The installation of telephones in the various schools was one of the subjects brought up at the meeting of the Parent-Teacher Association Monday night. At present, the only schools having telephones are the junior and senior high schools.

The state civil service commission this week set the date for the examination for call firemen and for police officer, the former at the request of the fire chief, the latter at the request of the Selectmen. The call firemen test will be on June 1 and the policeman test on June 5. Age limits for both are 21 and 35.

Many persons have been interested in the Richardson school and have given their time and attention to see that the trees were trimmed and the rubbish cleaned up.

"Fellow Travellers I've Met" was the subject of a talk given last night at the meeting of the A. P. C. Sorority by Principal Nathan C. Hamblin of the high school.

Many parents and friends of the children of the Shawsheen Community Sunday School met in Balmoral hall for the last service of that organization on Easter

Sunday afternoon. The Sunday school had been in operation for a dozen years.

### 25 Years Ago — April 1962

Little League will officially open the season Saturday, with an opening day doubleheader at the Playstead. Ceremonies will begin at 1 p.m. and will mark, not only the opening of this season, but also the tenth anniversary of the community's involvement in Little League baseball.

Raytheon's off-street parking problem is, we suppose, a community problem as well as a private one, with which the Company must come to grips. The facts are not hard to understand—Route 495 land-takings will chop off more than 120 Raytheon parking spaces from a lot that is already overcrowded.

New boundary lines for the elementary school under construction on Lovejoy Road were taken under consideration by the School Committee at its last meeting. Supt. of Schools Edward I. Erikson outlined some proposed boundaries that would bring 344 students into the new structure next September.

### 10 Years Ago — April 1977

Shawsheen School—in fact all neighborhood schools and their districts—will remain intact next year, despite declining enrollments. The School Committee has voted to delay former member Frank Griggs' proposal that the Shawsheen be phased out over the next two years, so that the elementary schools will not be disrupted next year.

The Selectmen Tuesday night voted not to attempt to act on filling the vacancy created by the resignation of Alan F. French until after Town Meeting in May. The board has issued a call for applications from interested townspeople.

## Jim Doherty Gets Upstaged By \$7 Item

The 1987 Town Meeting. When people think back on it, they'll probably remember, first, its length.

Those townspeople who were at the second session will also, certainly, remember the aerobic benefits they reaped from jumping up for standing votes on each and every land-taking article—exercise prompted by a few opposing votes to issues that, in other years, go largely unchallenged.

Not all of those hours of democracy were dry, however. The meeting had its charm—much of which was, as usual, the bailiwick of Moderator Jim Doherty.

Doherty's been running the show for years. He's relaxed; he's quick with an aside, even at the expense of poking fun at himself. Take, for example, the opening session this year when, after informing the crowd that there would be "no smoking—of anything—in the hall," he dutifully read an essay about the responsibilities of a Moderator.

By tradition, he read, the Moderator is "chosen because of his knowledge, fairness and moderate temperament."

He paused a beat. "Boy, have we gone downhill," he said.

He used his wit to try—usually in vain—to move things along. When Planning Board member Susan Stott reeled off her tedious street acceptance articles more quickly than her colleague/co-presenter had his, Doherty mused, "You move a little bit faster than (Paul) Curley—I think we'll give you all this stuff."

In spite of his skill, however, Lake Andover's once-a-year Garrison Keiler can be upstaged. And, on opening night this year, he was.

It happened on Article 11.

Article 11 was one of those automatic, mundane formalities that grace the first part of each year's warrant—a request to use "a sum not to exceed \$5,000" from available funds to pay any bills left over from last year. This year, the request was even more humdrum than usual—so much so that Selectman Bill Dalton called it "the most inconsequential article of the night."

The article's lack of consequence, explained Dalton, lay in the fact that the amount to be appropriated—upon the approval of no less than a required four-fifth's majority of the assembled voters—was seven dollars.

After the townspeople stopped laughing, Doherty opened his mouth to call for a vote. Atty. Bob Zollner, who acts as legal counsel for town boards, raised his hand.

In it was seven dollars.

Zollner pressed the money on the moderator in a generous attempt to balance Andover's budget. But democracy is democracy—and Doherty refused to withdraw the article.

The vote was unanimous—even the Finance Committee could find no fault with the appropriation.

Before Zollner could retrieve his seven bucks, it might be noted, Gerry Silverman, the Chairman of the Board of Selectmen, laid claim to it. With a big grin, he crammed it into the little white cap he had placed on the table to collect for his pet project, July fourth fireworks.

# Teachers Present Goals

At the request of the School Committee, Ed Bennett, president of the Andover Education Association, presented his bargaining unit's 1987-1988 goals Tuesday night.

Before presenting numerous proposals, Bennett expressed certain topics that were of concern to the membership.

A lack of information, Bennett said, has brought about low teacher morale. He also commented that the only time the administration listens to suggestions from the trenches is when those suggestions are in agreement with the administration's policy.

The association requested the opportunity to provide input on curriculum work and feels that directed professional days should be conducted after school or during the summer, so that classrooms are not abandoned, especially with the current substitute teacher crunch. In addition, he said, no new programs should be implemented without proper training and materials up front.

"Teachers support the investigation of other types of teaching," Bennett commented, and the association is not happy with the assumption that most teachers employ simple lecture method. "Don't fix it if it isn't broken," he said, and then stressed the importance of low teacher-pupil ratios in the classroom.

Bennett pointed out that a majority of the courses proposed to be cut at the high school level would be causing the end of a comprehensive educational program and a leaning toward strict academics. This type of program would leave business and industrial arts students out in the cold, he commented.

The association president then offered numerous suggestions and proposals to the committee.

Teachers would like to have notice of a new program one year in advance of its implementation and favors the proposal made some time ago by Committeeman David Birnbach to hold teacher training sessions during the summer.

To improve communications, Bennett suggested that there be a representative of the association sitting on the school committee in a non-voting capacity, as does Lisa Horgan, a representative of the high school students. In addition, he suggested that a school committee member be assigned as liaison to the association and that Superintendent Kenneth Seifert attend the first half-hour or so of each A. E. A. meeting. The association, said Bennett, is also interested in partici-

pating in informal "work meetings" with the school committee.

The association agreed with Seifert's goal of being more visible within the school buildings, paying more regular visits. Bennett also requested that administrative employees be trained in giving positive reinforcement to the teachers, in that it may help improve morale. The teachers are also requesting the opportunity to evaluate administrators before they are given tenure.

Teachers would like to see a greater amount of the budget dedicated to the purchase of texts, supplies and educational materials.

Finally, the association requested that all study committees be open to any interested teachers, instead of the administration hand-picking those who will participate.

In conclusion, Bennett commented that the association will continue to poll teachers and will be making further suggestions as they come to light.

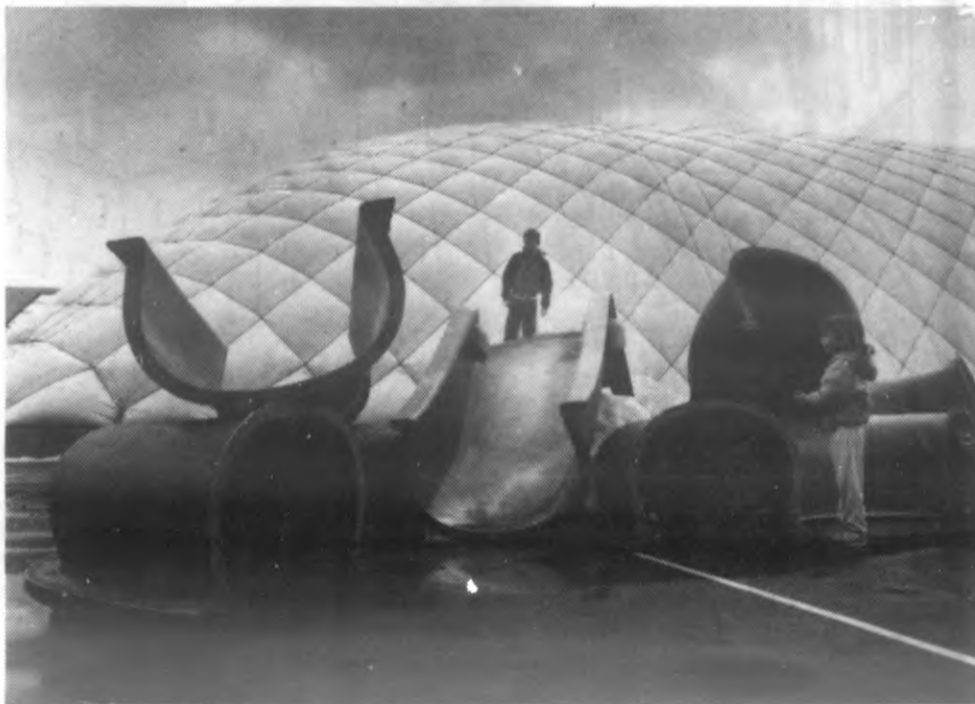
Candidates who cannot legitimately attend the scheduled tryouts or who may desire additional information should contact manager Al Pelletier to arrange special tryouts.

for use as part of the planned Emerson College campus.

According to Principal Planner Nancy Jeton, the developers maintain that traffic to and from the site will be about 40 percent lighter than that anticipated from the previously proposed industrial usage. She said that the town has commissioned a traffic study of its own from the Vanasse-Hangen engineering company. The study will be ready before the project's May 10 Comprehensive Permit hearing before the ZBA. Jeton expressed a concern that, should the Emerson College move not materialize, the land on the Lawrence side of the line could be landlocked by the development. She advised the developers to bring roadway and utility stubs to the Lawrence site.

Board member Paul Curley asked developer Jack Corcoran if the property would remain rental, rather than reverting to condominium usage.

Corcoran said that, by developing under Comprehensive Permit, he would be seeking subsidies from one of several state programs; most of those programs link developers into a set period of rental—such as 20 years.

"What are your zoning aspects that your Comprehensive Permit sort of steps around?" asked Chairman Michael Houghton—a reference to the fact that the permit nullifies local bylaws in exchange for the construction of lower-cost housing.

Architect Donnelly said that there were nine exceptions to the bylaw in all, including an override of height restrictions and the construction of residential units in an Industrial zone.

"Basically, you're responding to Emerson's coming," mused Houghton, adding, "That's my observation; you don't have to respond to it."

Only one resident criticized the plans. North Street's Olivier Goulet observed that, during the recent flood, four to eight inches of water lay on the land adjoining the parcel's road bed. "The land is very, very bad," he said. "Very, very wet."

Board member Carl Byers asked Corcoran if the project presented the "minimum number of units to make the site work out for you, economically?"

Corcoran said that it did. Of the 285 units, he added, 20 to 25 percent would probably be subsidized. He said that, under the three state programs he is considering for subsidy, the state Executive Office of Community Development is likely to include all 285 units, rather than just those that are subsidized, in its calculation of the percentage of lower-cost housing units offered by the town from its total stock. Communities where such housing constitutes 10 percent or more of the total are not required to subject themselves to Comprehensive Permit development.

Summarizing the board's views on the site plans, Chairman Houghton expressed concern over the massing of the buildings. "We have some concern with what the Conservation Com-

mission has to say to you," he added. "Other than that, we find it to be a fairly favorable project."

The board voted unanimously to recommend approval, with conditions to be set by the ConsCom, to the ZBA.

In other business, the board:

- approved preliminary plans for the five-lot "Bakers Meadow Estates" subdivision, off Argilla Road;

- gave a favorable recommendation, with 10 conditions, to site plans presented by Howland Development Co. for two warehousing buildings to be located on Lowell Junction Road. The buildings are planned to total 109,075 square feet of space, and would probably serve existing businesses in the area;

- granted a favorable recommendation to site plans for a 3,000 square foot addition to Dr. Lindsay's veterinary facility, located on Lowell Street, with the condition that landscape screening be implemented before the construction is completed.

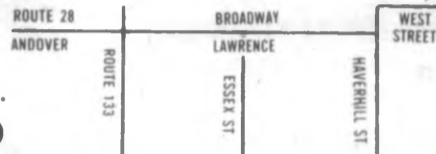

opment—a policy the town has long enforced for riverbank land.

For the land in Article 65, Mahony said, "The best sewer access is through Tewksbury—that's why Tewksbury will be involved in this."

Planning Board member Paul Curley lauded both articles as "one more avenue to retain control of our own destiny." He noted that Comprehensive Permit applications, which "threaten to destroy 25 years of careful, thoughtful planning" on the part of the town, have had little effect on Andover's low-cost housing shortage.

Hidden Road resident Debbie Moggio spoke emotionally and at length against Article 65. "This parcel is, by normal standards, not even in Andover," she said. The land was reached by a narrow road through Tewksbury; children who needed to be bused to Andover schools had no walkway to their pickup point on Burtt Road.

By using the parcel, she concluded, Andover was foisting its low-cost housing problems onto another community.

She added that, when she had walked the land, she had noted that it is also crossed by high-tension electrical wires.

"I don't care, ultimately, how the Town Meeting votes on this article," she said. "I simply want you to know what you're voting on."

"There are problems on this land," Town Manager Mahony agreed, "but there are problems that would be solved by this land."

York Street resident Bob Wescott asked what the incentive for private development of the land would be, given that the price of the units would limit profits from their sale.

Mahony said that incentives would include state land cost write-downs and utility subsidies, a relaxation of density requirements, and a smoother road through development-related processes.

When the vote came to 257 to 78 in favor of Article 65, Moggio called for a quorum count. Officials sealed the entrances and tallied a voting populace of 356, to cheers from proponents.

The second parcel targeted for town-monitored development, 67.52 acres bounded by the Boston and Maine railroad tracks, Haverhill Street, and the Lawrence town line, received an even warmer reception. Article 66 passed by a 326 to 17 vote.

Other business transacted at the third session of Town Meeting included:

- the appropriation of \$50,000 to complete the installation of street lights in Shawsheen Village, originally approved at the 1985 Town Meeting;

- passage of two articles, with appropriations totalling \$8,100, to support the televising of public meetings on the Cable community access channel;

- the acceptance of Governor's Drive, Montclair Avenue, Penni Lane, Seten Circle, Blackberry Lane, Teaberry Lane, Parthenon Circle, Pride's Lane, Pride's Circle North and South, and Bayberry Lane as public ways;

- the appropriation of \$30,000 to install four-way pedestrian crossing lights at Elm Street.

Horseback riders of the Pony Express once carried United States mail between St. Joseph, MO., and Sacramento, Calif. The service began on April 3, 1860, following the Oregon-California Trail, a 1,996-mile trip that took about ten days. Relay stations stood ten to 15 miles apart along the route, tended by keepers who took care of the ponies. As the rider approached the station, the keeper

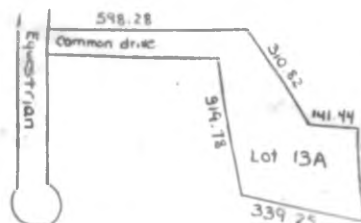

# Executive Session Precedes Action On Tenure Elections

While Bancroft employees gathered for the School Committee meeting Tuesday night in a show of support for Principal Iora Alexander, the committee attempted to decipher fact from fiction in an emergency executive session that delayed the regular meeting for nearly an hour.

According to Superintendent of Schools Kenneth Seifert, there had been public discussion about whether or not Alexander should receive tenure and that various rumors began to circulate. Committee Chairman Susan T. Poore called the emergency session in order that the rumors could be addressed before the committee was required to vote on Alexander's tenure during the regular meeting.

During the executive session, all present, including committee members, Seifert, Assistant Superintendent Lois Haslam, West Principal Jack Coyle and Iora Alexander herself, spoke their minds on the issues at hand, said Poore. "No one left that room until we'd said all we had to say," she commented in her apology for the delay.

Poore explained that letters and petitions in favor of Alexander's tenure were received from the staffs of both Bancroft and West Elementary, the Andover Administrative Association and the President of the Bancroft Parent-Teacher Association, and these were discussed during the executive session.

The chairman pledged to the community that the committee would "deal with all issues that arose" during the session and that everyone came to the realization that they would have to work together in this endeavor.

Poore added that she felt that "Iora is a stronger person for what she's gone through." The committee then voted in favor of Alexander's tenure—although not unanimously—the vote being 4-0-1, with committeeman David Birnbach passing.

Birnbach passed on the votes for tenure for both Alexander and Pupil Personnel Administrator Mary French, commenting that it was no reflection on the candidates, but an expression of discontent with the tenure process.

Birnbach felt that he was not provided

with adequate information regarding the individuals and their service to the system from the administration. He commented that he was simply told "things are going well." According to Birnbach, "that's not enough." He added that "my confidence in working with the administration is real low...I had no information."

Birnbach feels that tenure is given almost without thought, but Seifert contended that the administration does have an evaluation process in place and that if

the evaluation of a candidate were not favorable, he would not be recommending tenure for an individual.

Seifert later commented "something constructive can come out of this" and that "a more detailed evaluation process" may be the result of discussions by members of the committee. Although the central administration has an evaluation process in effect at present, the committee now feels it necessary to develop their own process for such candidates.

At this meeting, the committee will begin to establish goals and objectives and develop procedure for the group which will make either a positive or negative recommendation to the state for funding of proposed housing developments in town that will allot a portion of units to "affordable housing" needs.
