## Andover's Farnham signed by Patriots

A look at the current roster for the New England Patriots shows a name rather familiar to Andover sports fans.

On Monday, the Patriots officially announced the free-agent acquisition of Andover

High legend Buddy Farnham, after his record career as a receiver at Brown.

Following the NFL Draft on April 22-24,

undrafted Farnham made the most of his two-day invitation to the Patriots' recent rookie camp, doing enough to impress the New England brass and earn the chance to catch passes from NFL star Tom Brady.

One person hardly surprised to see Farnham earn this opportunity is Ken Maglio, Andover High football coach during Farnham's time in Blue and Gold.

"I knew Buddy was going to have an opportunity to make the mini camp as an invited free agent," said Maglio. "I read a blog that said No. 13 was having an outstanding first day and they thought he was from Brown. I knew it must be Buddy. Nobody ever outworked him."

In four years as a varsity standout for Andover (2002-05), Farnham set the Golden Warrior records for receptions (154), receiving yards (2,664) and interceptions (20) and finished his career with 21 touchdown catches. He was an All-Scholastic as a senior.

# Former Kaps building may get third floor

The look of Elm Square, the heart of downtown Andover, may be changing significantly as the new owner of the former Kaps building wants to add a third floor to the building.

The Design Review Board met Tuesday and approved plans that include adding a third story to the existing two-story building at the corner of Main and Central streets.

"Elm Square is large and with the library and the Musgrove Building, that corner needs mass," said Ann Constantine, the chairwoman of the Design at \$827,900. Review Board who called the project "the most important downtown building project in

The next stop for the plans is the Planning Board, which meets Tuesday, May 11 and will discuss the plans.

Building owner R. Thomas "Tom" Belhumeur expects the building to be a "bridal destination" spot with a group of wedding-related businesses.

Proposed plans dated April 13 and on file at the town's Planning office included a drawing of what the building might look like. However, Constantine said the April 13 plans are outdated

as she has met with the building owner twice since then and has viewed newer designs. Adding a third floor to the building has always been presented.

Belhumeur, who was in Town Offices as the Townsman received the April 13 design plans, said tenants are being booked and the renovation is "going great."

He named the building "One Main Street" and said the projected opening date for this new block of wedding-related businesses is Sept. 1.

Records from the town assessors office show he bought the building for \$1.2 million on Dec. 22. 2009. The building is assessed

Cristina's, a women's dress shop currently located in the Belhumeur-owned building at 10-16 Main St., is moving to "One Main Street." The dress shop, a 25-year tenant, will be on the ground level and will also have basement space.

Belhumeur said a limousine company and a tuxedo store also are planned for the building. First Date has closed its Chestnut Street store and owners have said they will reopen a shop with a bridal theme in the new building.

## **Town Meeting** votes are in. What now?

Voters at Town Meeting bought open space near Fosters Pond said to be a great deal, but otherwise tightened purse strings by keeping off street lights, defeating a plan to add parking to a playing field complex, and delaying a plan to move the town yard.

But what happens now? For one thing, the town will try to get a state grant that could cut the town's cost for the Fosters Pond land in half.

Here's a look at some of the major decisions of Town Meeting and what happens next, now that the votes have been taken.

#### **STREET LIGHTS**

Andover's streets and neighborhoods will remain dark after a private warrant article penned by resident Chester Darling failed at the first night of Town

Article 16 would have reversed selectmen's 2009 decision to shut dark, and the lack of illuminaoff 626 of Andover's 1,704 total street lights as a cost-saving measure.

Now, the original group will stay off, and 50 more may go dark. Chuck Edgerly, public safety officer for the Andover Police, is drafting a list of additional street lights not needed for safety to bring before selectmen over the summer, possibly in June

# Careful balance needed at Town Meeting

Some Andover residents are proud to point out that Andover may boast the largest Open Town Meeting in the world. It takes work to sustain such a Town Meeting, and as the town continues to grow, there is increased grumbling that it may be time for Andover to move to another form of government with more accountability, whether that is representative Town Meeting or a mayor system.

Town Meeting is meant to allow all interested residents to gather, debate and vote on issues important to them. In recent years, in the interest of moving the meeting along, time limits for speakers have been established. But for Town Meeting to work, all involved need to be careful not to go too far, snuffing out the life of Town Meeting along with repetitive discussion.

This year, for instance, a resident called for a vote on the street-lights issue, while small lines of residents were standing at both "pro" and "con" microphones to debate the issue. Residents decided to end discussion and take the vote. All of this is within the bounds of Town Meeting, but the street-lights issue was one of the only ones people showed up to debate at Town Meeting, and there was limited discussion even there. Also, additional discussion was quashed by town officials. This year, the town did not allow an amendment asking for street lights to be paid out of departmental budgets, saying it would be "de facto reconsideration" of the budget. (The amendment was proposed by Bob Pokress. Last year, Town Council Tom Urbelis claimed Pokress's two articles trying to control sick time buyback would have violated state law, although the ombudsman disagreed.)

If residents aren't interested in hearing debate and town officials are going to block ideas they disagree with from even coming to a vote, what is the point of a Town Meeting? The issues can be voted on more quickly and more people will turn out for a ballot vote at an all-day election.

We support Open Town Meeting, but Andover must be careful to keep a great emphasis on the "Open" part of it.

# Growth of something special at Andover High

Future biology students involved in nands-on learning will truly get some dirt under their fingernails, thanks to a pair of Andover High seniors.

A 10-foot by 8-foot greenhouse was researched and built in the courtyard of Andover High School by Advanced Placement Biology students Brian McQuaide and Matt Liffmann.

The greenhouse will help biology students put theory into practice, and see how things work in the real world. But it won't just help budding biologists. Melanie Cutler, the AHS environmental science teacher, who helped Liffmann and McQuaide with the project, told reporter Bethany Bray that AHS journalism, Spanish, art, geometry and special education classes already have plans to incorporate the garden into projects and lessons. Even students who never go into the garden, may benefit from it by eating its produce in the school cafeteria.



## Four acres, a coat and cash: How Andover was settled

#### **Andover stories**

In 1629 a 20-year-old cartographer, William Wood, arrived in the colony at Sagus (Lynn). Under the Council of New England Company of John Endecott's charter, he began mapping the northern shore of Massachusetts Bay, rivers, tributaries and noted existing native and immigrant settlements. In his published book New England Prospect in 1634, Wood states that in his opinion "Agawam (Ipswich) is the best place but one, which is Merrimack, where the river is twenty leagues navigable". Wood's map marks Pemtuckett (Haverhill) as a settlement. Twenty-six miles up river from the ocean is the "great water" falls Cochichawicke, called by the natives, the area that would become the plantation town of Andover.

Gov. John Winthrop arrived in 1630 with his "Massachusetts Bay Company Charter" granted by King Charles. Puritan Winthrop represented interests in England concerned with governing the new plantation, but

also the economic possibilities in the fur trade market of his financial backers, including the Earl of Lincoln. Two of the most valuable trade items for the local Indian populations were beaver pelts and land. Winthrop wasted little time in encouraging interior settlements as nearly 25 townships had been settled since Plimouth Plantation.

The first Legislative act concerning Andover was held at the General Court in New Town (Boston) on March 4, 1634. It ordered that all the land of the place called Cochchichewicke be reserved for an Inland Plantation. To entice settlement of the nearly 70 square miles of land the Court promised immunity from all taxes, levies, public charges and services for three years. The only obligation attached to the order was service to the military. John Winthrop, William Bellingham, and William Coddington, Esq., were chosen as a committee to grant license to anyone that they think met the requirements to inhabit there. Only those who swore allegiance to the covenant were granted charters. The power to select a population of virtuous and

the committee.

John Woodbridge and Simon Bradstreet had been selected to settle Cochchicewicke in 1640 but the settlement stalled as a dispute over the boundary with Rowley ensued. The Court ruled Brook, that runs from the top against Rowley's claim and the plantation began in 1643 but it would be two years before Woodbridge would be ordained pastor in October 1645.

Seven months later at the General Court at Boston, "on the 6th, 3d month, 1646," Chief Cutshamache, acknowledged that he had sold for the sum of £6 and a coat, "to Mr. John Woodbridge, in Behalf of the Inhabitants of Cochicawick, now called Andover, all his Rights. Interests, and Privilege in the Land... provided that the Indian called Roger, and his company, may have Liberty to take Alewives in Cochicawick River, for their own Eating; but if they either spoil or steal any Corn, or other Fruit to a Considerable Value of the Inhabitants there, this Liberty of taking Fish shall forever cease. And the said Roger is still to Enjoy four Acres of Ground where now he plants."

## Springtime in war, 1919: Andover goes over the top

over the top," bragged the spring 1919 issues of the Andover Townsman. The Third Liberty Loan Drive to aid

the war effort in France was

"going over the top." The phrase "going over the top" was a military term that originated with the trench warfare in World War I. It meant that when a whistle blew three times it ordered you and your fellow troops to climb over the top of the relative safety of the rotten, stench-filled trench you lived in and on to "no man's land," which separated you from the enemy German trenches

On the other side of no man's

land were rolls of barbed wire, German machine guns, mortars, grenades, and poison gas waiting to kill you. If you were successful, you might drive the enemy out of his first line of trenches and gain a few 100 yards of muddy land, filled with the enemy's trenches and the smell of death. In your new location you could expect a counter-attack within days or perhaps hours.

It was the way much of the war was fought on the Western Front in Europe, and it was the way millions of men and boys were killed or maimed. It was an insane way to run a war and the old politicians and military men who issued the orders to fight it that way decimated the generation who fought it and starved their citizens.

Andover's Third Liberty Loan Drive collected a total of \$539,000 from 1,782 citizens. In

Of the more than 20,000 registered voters in Andover, 652 attended the first night of Town Meeting on April 28. The second night, attended by 345 voters, ended by 9:25 p.m.

Fifty-six warrant articles were debated, voted on or withdrawn in a little more than five hours.

Last week marked Andover's fourth Town Meeting in the last 12 months, as Special Town Meetings were held in August and October. May 2009 Town Meeting spanned three nights and more than 10 hours; 1,089 residents attended the first night, 467 the second and 363 the third night.





# It's not easy building green

# Student pair's project builds greenhouse in AHS courtyard

Andover High is no agricultural school, but it now has its own greenhouse.

The 10 by 8 foot stucture was built by Advanced Placement Biology students Brian McQuaide and Matt Liffmann in the courtyard of Andover High School. Not only will the flowers and vegetables grown inside supply a student-sown sustainable garden, but the polycarbonite and steel greenhouse will last for years of students to use.

Tomato and pepper plants went in last week, and even AHS Principal Jonathan Harris has been digging in the dirt with students.

"It took a while to find a way to do this," said McQuaide. "I learned not to stop when things don't go the way you've planned."

The greenhouse will be used for the sustainable garden project at AHS, an interdisciplinary initiative that has students growing veggies for use in the school cafeteria and at the Andover Farmers Market. Outside of the greenhouse, students have planted patches of lettuce, spinach, peas, strawberries and bush blueberries.

AHS journalism, Spanish, art, science, geometry and special education classes have incorporated the garden into projects and lessons, said Melanie Cutler, AHS environmental science teacher.

Liffmann and McQuaide, both seniors, built the greenhouse because they agree with the project's focus on sustainable food production, but also because it offered a hands-on alternative to writing for the final project required in AP Biology.

"We thought constructing something would be more fun than sitting in front of a computer screen and typing 25 pages on cancer cells or something," said Liffmann. But the project turned out to be

anything but simple. After spending hours on an application, the duo were awarded

a \$1,075 grant from the Punchard Trustees for the project. They spent the winter researching and planning what type of

greenhouse they would build, checking with the town planning and building departments on what would be allowed in the AHS courtyard.

They purchased a greenhouse kit online, deciding it would

"I can feel the movement in my knee a lot," she said. "If I twist my knee or step too hard I feel it move. That's when I know I have to step back and take a few minutes off. But I would never think of giving up tennis."
