## Medical center here could open eyes to Lawrence offerings

There was a time when Andover people went to Lawrence for just about everything. Now, there are residents who won't visit the Immigrant City for anything, even their medical care.

So Lawrence General Hospital and Pentucket Medical

Associates are coming to them.

The two established Merrimack Valley medical organizations are teaming up to build a \$15.5 million medical center at 307 Lowell St., on land across from the Andover IRS and by the junction of Interstate 93 and Route 133. Leaders of the groups believe the Andover site will help introduce

people here to the improvements made to their other local medical facilities during the last several years.

"There is so much out-migration of people who are [travelling] down to Boston for really routine care. There is very, very little that anybody needs to go to Boston for, with all the capability that we have at Lawrence General, and with Pentucket

Medical and the wide variety of specialists we have," said Dianne Anderson, president and CEO of Lawrence General. "There's really no reason for people to go through all that inconvenience and expense."

Lawrence General has spent millions to upgrade its hospital, even offering free valet parking. It has partnered with PMA and Beth

Israel Deaconess Medical Center to create a cardiac cath lab that it says outperforms the industry gold standard; it takes Lawrence General 64 minutes to have a balloon inflated in a patient, while the industry standard is 90 minutes.

Lawrence General has also partnered with the Floating Hospital for Children at Tufts Medical Center to staff its

new \$600,000 Pediatric Center, which has private rooms.

But many in Andover continue to travel to the Boston hospitals.

During the first quarter of this year, about 16 percent of patients staying at Lawrence General were from Andover and North Andover, neighboring towns to the city. And

## Voters will be asked to redo DMS site with youth center \$2.5 million project

The Cormier Family Youth Center will come up frequently at this year's Annual Town Meeting, with at least three separate votes impacting the project.

A Special Town Meeting within the regular Town Meeting will ask people to divide a town-maintained trust and spend half the money on youth center construction. A separate Annual Town Meeting article has been written to move the building 35 feet to the north.

Finally, voters will be asked to spend \$2.5 million to replace all paved surfaces around Doherty Middle School, a capital improvement request that follows

the town's work last year to redesign all paved surfaces around West Elementary School. The youth center will be built behind Doherty

## Andover High grad looks to score with Haitian soccer program

A soccer-loving Andover High School graduate is looking to bring the sport to a group of girls across the globe who otherwise wouldn't have a chance to play.

Molly Klarman, who grew up in Andover on Lovejoy Road, has seen firsthand that while soccer may be the top sport in Latin countries, it is almost exclusively a pastime for boys in some areas. In Haiti, for example, girls are basically discouraged from playing soccer, she said.

So when she ended up working at a hospital in rural Haiti after earning her master's degree, she decided to start a girls soccer team in addition to being involved with a number of

different projects, she wrote in an email.

Like most kids in Andover, Klarman, a 2002 graduate of Andover High School, started playing soccer at age 6 and continued straight through high school before joining the team at Lewis and Clark College in Portland, Ore.

After graduating from college in 2006 with degrees in biology and chemistry, she took a long break from soccer and went on to pursue her master's in public health at Emory University in Atlanta, completing her degree focusing on global environmental health in 2009.

Klarman, who had spent a lot of time in Latin America and the Caribbean, with internships in Costa Rica, Belize, Ecuador and the Dominican Republic,

intended to work internationally again. This time, she set her sights on Haiti.

It was there that she really started missing soccer.

"I realized I had really missed playing, although now I'm more of a coach than a player," she wrote.

And the girls exclusion from soccer in Haiti started bothering her.

"Soccer is the main recreational activity in Haiti, but it is almost exclusively for boys," she wrote. "The boys are out playing in the streets every afternoon and when there is a match, the whole community comes to watch."

"We wanted to start a team for girls, too, so that they could feel

that's up 2.1 percent from the previous months.

Anderson and Thomas Fazio, MD, president of Pentucket Medical, believe the new Andover Medical Center & ExpressCare will help open the door and expose more people in town to what is available locally.

"This allows them to get good medicine for relatively minor, common, nuisance problems that they have. We think that's also a great entree into our practice, and into the Lawrence General, because there may be some hesitancy with some of the patients in that area wanted to get started with the hospital or with a physicians group," said Fazio. "But if they go in and see its a well run organization that is doing the right things, that lessens those barriers."

The Andover center will have both primary care and specialists, who will work at Beth Israel or the Tufts Floating Hospital some days and at the Andover center other days. Doctors who live locally

may be attracted to work at the center.

"[This site] allowed us to go into an area that we thought was deficient in the number of doctors that were actually in that area anymore. That's useful for the primary care point of view," said Fazio. "Plus there's this concept of urgent care - a good concept - that people can't many times get in to see their primary care, because their schedules are such that its difficult to do that."

The "ExpressCare" part of the center is the place to

bring kids who were injured on the soccer field, or to treat things such as injuries from falls, sinus infections, fevers and back aches.

The center is expected to be completed later this year. "Right now everyone is talking about the cost of health care," said Anderson. "We're all about keeping care local at an affordable, high quality that's right in our hometown."

LGH says its procedures can cost \$10,000 less than those being done in Boston.

comfortable playing with other girls (and) learn the rules, new techniques and skills as most of them had never played before."

And, she goes a step further, offering the girls lessons on health education and life skills, as well as team-building activities.

"We started with about 25 girls and within a month had more than 50 girls regularly attending practice. Unfortunately, we had to start turning away girls because we don't have the resources to accommodate so many girls," she wrote.

Klarman's Andover roots remind her that team sports help build character and provide valuable life lessons.

"There aren't very many opportunities (in Haiti) for adolescents, especially girls, to socialize together and just be kids. Typically after school, they return home to do chores. ...

"One of my colleagues, Taryn Silver of Sharon, and I wanted to provide the girls here in Haiti with those same Andover

opportunities. It's been very well received in the community with lots of people offering to help, attending our activities and watching our matches," she wrote.

But funds for things like bringing equipment to Haiti, providing water and a snack at practice and paying for transportation are limited.

## YOUTH: Plan to link Doherty work

Middle School, so supporters believe it makes sense to redesign the Doherty Middle parking lot next, rather than another schools.

The Doherty Middle project was slated to go before voters a few years down the road, according to Ed Ataide, superintendent of the town's building division.

"When the youth center talked about being built back there, we moved [the Doherty project] up to the same year to introduce some cost-saving measures, so we didn't dig up the same site twice," he said.

Original estimates put the Doherty Middle project's price tag at \$3.2 million. Efficiencies gained by running the project at the same time as the youth center construction lowered that cost estimate by \$700,000, Ataide said.

The site's soil conditions are less than favorable for a large-scale construction project, adding to the work that needs to be done, according to Ataide.

A variety of buildings were built on the land at the turn of the 20th century, including a power plant, according to Ataide. When soil samples were done on the site during the youth center's design phase, officials found fill that a youth center could not be built upon. Because of that, "the soil has to be removed - [across] the whole footprint of the building," Ataide said. To comply with Occupational Safety and Health Administration regulations, a sloping section 16 feet long that starts eight feet deep must also be dug out around the building's footprint, according to Ataide.

That digging would cut into the Doherty Middle School's driveways. Additional digging would also cut through the school's driveways to run power, water and sewer service from nearby streets to the youth center, Ataide said.

The plan is to dig in and build the youth center's foundation while the town also replaces the paved areas around the school, according to Chris Huntress, Andover Youth Center Building Committee chairman.

Officials are hoping the \$2.5 million warrant article is approved. They're unsure what would happen if the youth center construction went forward without a process to replace Doherty's paved surfaces set in stone. "If they don't approve the [Doherty project] and the

youth center is definitely breaking ground in August, we're going to be working throughout the fall, ripping up that bus lane and drop-off area behind the school," Huntress said.

A portion of the youth center's budget is also paying for a share of the Doherty Middle site project, though how much will be spent exactly wasn't available this week, according to Huntress and Ataide.

The youth center's portion of the project covers the 19 parking spaces set aside for the building and any work needed to run utilities to the building, Ataide said.

### TRAFFIC PATTERN IN FLUX

Another detail about the project currently in flux is access to the site. As it stands, one entrance for the senior center, youth center and Doherty Middle School would feed off Chestnut Street, run along Whittier Court and lead out to Bartlet Street, according to Huntress.

The building committee is hoping to make the Bartlet Street access two-way, giving traffic intended for the youth center a second means of accessing the building through a parking area to the south of the school, according to Huntress.

The driving lane for buses and parent pick-up and drop-off wrapping around the school would remain one-way, flowing from Chestnut Street to Bartlet Street, according to Huntress.

Town fire and safety officials are reviewing the plan, and Huntress hopes they'll side with the committee, he said.

## Students to spend spring vacation in China

While many Andover families may travel for April vacation next week, one group of high school students will visit to the other side of the globe.

Around a dozen students will spend their week at the Hengshui School in China's Hebei's province next week, where they will sit in on Chinese classes, visit landmarks and even perform in a music festival.

The trip is made possible through a \$11,000 grant from the Asia Society's Confucius Classrooms program. Each student had to pay \$2,200 to attend the trip, and no additional cost was borne by the school district, according to Jorge Allain, world language program advisor.

Andover High School Principal Chris Lord said the trip is "a great opportunity for the kids to learn about a culture they have read about and studied."

For district Superintendent Marinel McGrath, the effect on each student extends far beyond being able to apply classroom lessons.

"You can never know how

much it will impact their awareness, the opportunity to have a different perspective, to build a greater understanding, greater tolerance," she said.

Many of the students agreed.

"Learning Chinese is one thing in a classroom. Going over there is a completely different thing," student Ali Hale said. "There is nothing like going and getting hands-on and seeing it for yourself."

The students will stay on the Hengshui School's campus for most of the trip, according to Chinese teacher Mei Lynn. At one point, they'll break off and visit landmarks like the Great Wall of China and Forbidden City.

However, not all of the students going over know how to speak Chinese. Some are going for the trip's extra-curricular value.

"Once I heard about this opportunity, I wanted to go to learn about the education system or to learn about the culture," student Hugh Smith said.

Student Michael Hanscom said the trip is "one of those things where, if I don't do it now, I will never get to do it."

"If you have an opportunity to explore a culture so different than your own, you should do it," he said.

The students are also playing at a music festival at the school. Their performance will center around a single

theme: traveling through America.

"We're kind of showing them America through its arts," student Devika Ranjan said. "You don't need language to communicate."

The students will leave on

Saturday, and their flight to China will take them over the North Pole, according to Lord. They'll return Sunday afternoon, the day before school returns to session.

For school officials, there's a hope that student trips

abroad will continue in the future as Andover High School develops a relationship with the Hengshui School to become the town's "friendship school."

With the relationship, Chinese and American students would regularly travel internationally to visit each other's schools. There could be a greater connection for the Chinese students staying in Andover, however. With no on-campus housing at the high school, it will be up to Andover families to provide room and board to students coming to the United States, according to Lord.

But whether the students stay on campus or in the home of another family, they're building relationships that student Saalik Lokhandwala said could last forever.

"Later in life, you're able to go back to those people you met as a young adult or teenager," he said.

That's what Hugh said he has wanted to do since students from the school visited Andover earlier this year.

"Ever since, I've been emailing them, like pen pals," he said. "I really have started to look forward to seeing them."

## Geography wiz: It's just a hobby

### High Plain fifth-grader one of state's top 100

If you ask him, Alistair McBrien is just a kid who likes to read. He taught himself how to plow through literary content as a tot, and today his material of choice is National Geographic.

There's no particular reason why, the 11 year old says. Geography isn't his favorite thing on earth. When he isn't reading, he's building models of historic aircraft, and he envisions himself being a dog trainer when he grows up.

So when the National Geographic Bee moved through High Plain Elementary School a few weeks ago, it was a welcome surprise to his family when he found himself taking top honors at his school and ending up in a statewide geography bee.

"We didn't really know he had such a knowledge of geography until this school bee," said his mother, Angela McBrien. She attributes his success to "a really good memory for all kinds of facts."

"He has always read everything. He taught himself how to read when he was 2 and a half," she said. "That's what's helping him in the geography bee."

Earlier this year, the Geography Bee process started for Alistair when his school brought the bee to its fifth-graders. Every student was given seven questions to answer, and he got five correct. After securing a tie-breaker win to net a second-place spot in his class, Alistair went on to the school's finals.

"I won that," he said. "Then I had to take a test."

He soon found out he was among the top 100 test scores in Massachusetts, sending him to a statewide geography bee in Worcester last Friday, April 5.

The winner of the contest nets \$100, the complete National Geographic archive on DVD and a trip to Washington D.C. for the contest's national finals in May, hosted by Alex Trebek. The winner of the national contest receives an all-expenses paid trip to the Galápagos Islands.

For the National Geographic enthusiast, it's a dream vacation.

Alistair was excited about the trip to Worcester, he said, because he got "to take a day off of school, and even better, it doesn't count [as an absence] because I'm doing something," he said.

In advance of heading to the state finals, Alistair said he didn't plan on studying or reading back-issues of National Geographic.

Then again, he didn't study or prepare for either of the two school bees he went

through. "I don't think I'll do anything because I didn't do anything [at the school level]," he said. "If I goof up this round by studying, then I'd ruin whatever has gotten me this far."

When asked if he'd at least brush up by reading material on Wikipedia, he frantically shook his head.

"I don't trust Wikipedia that much because anyone can put something on it," he scornfully said.

Unfortunately, Alistair won't be going to the nation's

capitol. He was among the majority of state finalists — around 90 of the top 100 scorers from the Berks to the North Shore — who were knocked out in the first round of the bee in Worcester, his mother said.

The questions students faced were above and beyond what Alistair faced at High Plain Elementary, covering topics that Angela said were "really testing the kids."

"He did well, but not good enough," she said, with a chuckle. "He was part of the majority."

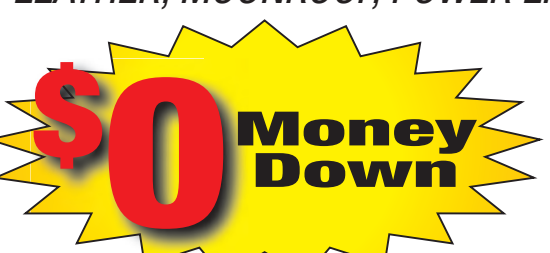

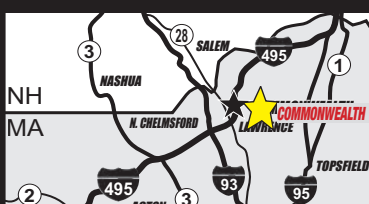

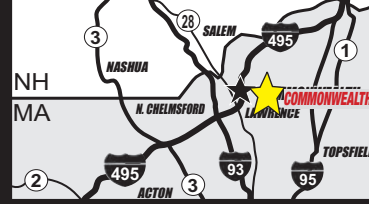

## 1,700 turn out for the troops

More than 1,700 people ran and walked the star-spangled Run for the Troops through downtown Andover Sunday, helping to raise money on behalf of veteran Kevin Dubois.

Between Sunday's race and a dinner event held at the Wyndham Hotel on Old River Road Friday, April 5, the community raised around \$30,000 to help build a home for Marine Cpl. Kevin Dubois, according to co-organizer Bill Pennington. Specifically, the events raise money for Homes For Our Troops, a national non-profit organization that builds homes it gives for free to people disabled fighting in the War on Terrorism.

The groundbreaking for Dubois' home, to be built for his needs in Rhode island, is scheduled for May 18, Pennington said.

Events prior to the race honored Dubois and the beneficiaries of the last two years of Homes For Our Troops events in town: Army Sgt. Joe Smith, who received a home in 2011, and Marine Sgt. Josh Bouchard, who was the focus of the events in 2012.

"It was more than what I expected," said Dubois after the race. "Andover isn't even my town. The support is ridiculous. The course is beautiful; the town put up all the flags along the course. It's a great race."

Many from Andover and beyond said they came to the event to show their appreciation for the military.

Mark Chisholm of Foster Circle in Andover ran with his three children, Charlotte, 10; and 8-year-old twins Jake and Zack.

"We just wanted to come out and support the troops. There are over 30,000 servicepeople with injuries, including some real bad injuries," he said.

Chisholm was in the Marines Reserves during the 1980s.

"My generation, we were lucky. We didn't have to go to war," he said. "You realize now, anyone coming into the military is going somewhere."

Even with this being a critical time for Boston Marathon preparations, race-course workers like Chris Lane of Boston, who helps prepare the Boston course, woke up at 4 a.m. Sunday to help prepare Andover streets for the Run for the Troops.

While there are some serious runners who tackle the course, many attend the event only because of its message.

A group did the course together for Andover Marine Patrick Robb, with Anne Marie Concemi

## Two Andover men in Washington's elite Guards

### Reflections on Patriots' Day

Patriots' Day is a special day in New England commemorating the beginning of the American fight for independence. The Revolution against the British began in Massachusetts at Lexington and Concord on the early morning of April 19, 1775. For many years the event was celebrated in Massachusetts and Maine, a colony of Massachusetts at that time, on the traditional date. Since 1969 it has been observed on the third Monday in April.

One hundred and five Minute Men from Andover answered the Lexington

alarm, although they arrived as the British were retreating. Joined by 230 foot soldiers from this town they pursued the enemy to Cambridge. Throughout the war Andover sent 700 men to the battlefield. Many of them were recognized for their contribution.

Peter Martin and John Lovejoy were among a select number of Revolutionary soldiers chosen to serve in the elite Commander-in-Chief's Guard. The men were hand-picked by General George Washington to fill a two-year commitment. Although a good deal is recorded about their military experience, little is known of their personal lives. One of them met a tragic fate while a member of the group. The strict

requirements demanded of "the flower of the American Army" speak highly of the Andover men's character.

The Guard, also known as Washington's Life Guard, was formed in the spring of 1776 in Cambridge. Its purpose was to protect the commander-in-chief and the official papers of the Continental Army. The unit, consisting of approximately 180 infantry and cavalry, accompanied Washington in all battles. Because it was an honor to belong to the Guard an effort was made to include soldiers from each of the 13 original colonies.

The General directed the formation of a corps of "sober, intelligent and reliable men." The Guard was initially created by selecting four qualified men from

each regiment of the Continental Army present at the siege of Boston. From that group the necessary number of men was picked.

Washington stipulated that the qualified soldier should demonstrate "habits of sobriety, honesty and good behavior." Candidates were to be between 5' 8" and 5' 10" tall and "handsomely and well-made." The General expressed that as there was nothing more desirable in his eyes than cleanliness in a soldier, the men should be "neat and spruce."

At 16, Peter Martin was among 335 Andover men who answered the alarm of April 19, 1775. John Lovejoy was 32 when in December 1775 he joined Captain John Abbot's Company for one year.

Both men enlisted in the 11th Massachusetts Regiment for a term of three years in February 1777. Martin fought in the battle of Stillwater in New York. The Andover men were among four candidates from the regiment recommended to the Guard in 1778. Both residents were selected and transferred that March to General Washington's headquarters at Valley Forge. By then Congress had finally approved supplies for the troops who had suffered through the winter without adequate food and clothing. Several Andover men were among the troops. One of them died.

That spring the Army was re-vitalized by Prussian military expert Baron Friedrich von Steuben, who oversaw

the training and discipline of the men, including the Guard. Von Steuben's training regimen showed immediate results in battles against the British at Barren Hill and Monmouth, N.J. Martin and Lovejoy participated in the confrontation at Monmouth on June 28, 1778.

Martin served the Guard until 1780. Following his commitment he enlisted with the 2nd Massachusetts and saw action at Yorktown, Va. He continued his military career to war's end in 1783.

Private Lovejoy's service with the Guard was short-lived. In October 1778, while attending an anniversary celebration of Burgoyne's Saratoga defeat, he was run over by a horse and died of his injuries.

#### 75 Years Ago April 8, 1938

The selectmen on Monday evening made their annual appointments, with changes being few. Edward Lefebvre was named to the Pumps Pond committee to take the place of the late chairman William Crowley. A number of special officers were dropped from the list.

A meeting on the trucking situation will be held in the town hall next Tuesday evening, the Board of Selectmen having invited 21 trucking concerns to send representatives. It is hoped that co-operation will be given by the concern in an endeavor to minimize the traffic problem through the center of the town, especially during the race-track season at Rockingham.

The selectmen Monday evening voted to call a Special Town Meeting to be held the evening of April 20, at 7:30, in the Memorial Auditorium to reconsider the Elm Street reconstruction project and the sidewalk appropriations of \$4,500 and \$1,700

#### 50 Years Ago April 11, 1963

The selectmen have placed themselves in a "general employee" category—thus compelling members of the Board to abstain from doing any business with the town or representing anyone before town boards. While dealing severely with themselves, three members of the board present at Monday night's meeting wanted it understood that all personnel classifications under the conflict of interest law are for the protection of the individuals, and in no way reflect on the board's opinion of their honesty, capabilities or desire to serve the community.

Local Raytheon officials vigorously denied rumors this week that the plant will eventually be closed. Vartkes Sohigian, speaking for the firm, stressed the absence of any plan leading to an end to Raytheon operations in Andover. His statement followed not long after a published denial by company officials, in response to queries by Congressman F. Bradford Morse.

Patients of Dr. Robert D. Ramsdell of North Main Street will be interested in hearing that his office nurse Mrs. David Robichaud is leaving at the end of April. She will be replaced by Mrs. John Daigle of Lawrence. Confusing as it will be, Mrs. Daigle's first name is "Polly" too. Mrs. Robichaud is the former Pauline Mower of Andover.

#### 25 Years Ago April 7, 1988

Andover citizens approved the requested \$49.5 million annual budget at the Town Meeting Monday night. This is a 14-percent increase over last year's operating expenses. Several warrants, which required funds, were also approved by the town.

This amounted to approximately 1 million additional dollars, according to Anthony Torrisi, finance and budget director. The total town budget for next year is approximately \$50.5 million.

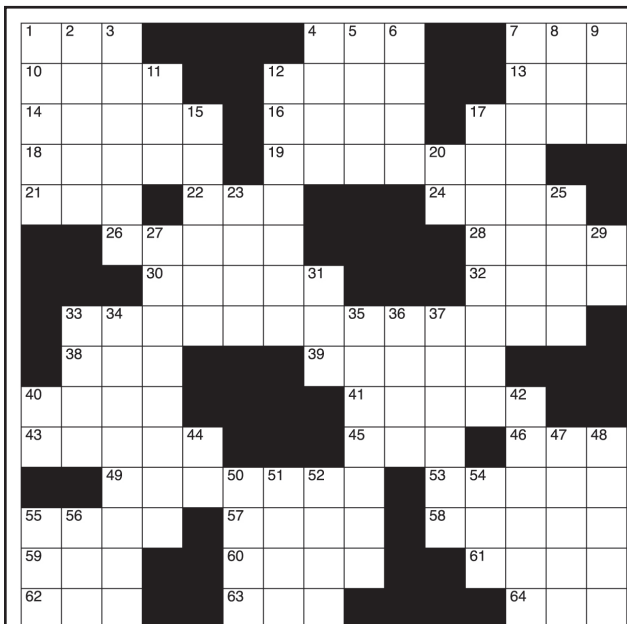

## Meals on wheels Mess Haul readies to roll into Andover

There's good news for local foodies as the latest food craze is making its way to Andover.

An Andover couple who earned their culinary stripes at Palmer's Restaurant and Tavern on Elm Street hope to park their new food truck on Main Street at the end of next month.

The official launch of Mess Haul is planned for mid to late May, said Stefanie Auchterlonie, who is partnering with Mark Stout on the new venture.

"This is our dream. We have wanted to work in culinary on our own and decided this was a great way to do it," said Auchterlonie, a 2003 Andover High School graduate who has worked at Palmer's for several years.

Stout, a 1999 Andover High School graduate who was the head chef at Palmer's for 10 years, said he knows "Andover's

palate" quite well and believes the food truck will be a hit.

"Adventurous and they know what they like," Stout said of Andover's taste buds.

About the size of a Federal Express truck and Army green in color, Auchterlonie said Mess Haul will be an eye-catcher.

"It's very military with pin-up girls painted on it and has a B-17 bomber theme. We really like the military theme and mess hall is where they eat in the military," she said.

Auchterlonie said the food truck has been ordered through a Florida company that specializes in designing food trucks. It need to be custom built and retrofitted to include all of the desired appliances while being up to Massachusetts code, she said.

The business needs a permit from Andover's Health Department and Auchterlonie has already met with

director Tom Carbone.

"This is not a new concept. We've given permits to hot dog carts and two cupcake trucks. They need to comply with federal and state health codes and they will," Carbone said.

The couple has also been in touch with the Police Department and Zoning Board.

The food truck trend is in its early stages in the Northeast, but has been popular down south and out west, Auchterlonie said. The couple has spent more than a year planning and saving, but the truck now has been bought.

The ideal parking spot for Mess Haul is on Main Street at Chestnut or Bartlett streets, Auchterlonie said. The truck is expected to be open for breakfast and lunch to start.

"We can't wait. Andover is just a great spot for our truck," Auchterlonie said.

## Star underclassmen dreaming of boys track title for Warriors

The up-and-coming Andover track star has seen his name misspelled countless times, not to mention the mispronunciations.

So, to make it clear, his name is - Hamza Naveed.

"I've seen it spelled all sorts of ways," he said with a laugh, looking through his neon pink sunglasses. "But hey, at least people still know who I am."

If you don't know Naveed's name yet, expect to be hearing plenty of it for the next two-plus years.

The sophomore sprinter leads an outstanding group of Golden Warrior track underclassmen that has Andover dreaming of another boys All-State title in the upcoming seasons.

"This foundation of freshmen and sophomores is the best we have had in a long time," said Warriors coach Peter Comeau. "Not to say we don't have a very good group of juniors and seniors. But we have really impressive young guys in nearly every event."

Naveed, a jet-fast sprinter, is front and center in a group of budding stars that includes sophomores Andrew Matteucci (hurdles), Andrew Marotta (throwing) and Sebastian Silveira (sprints) and freshmen Oliver Eberth (sprints, jumps) and Robert Pineault (distance).

"It really is awesome to think that we could really be able to accomplish something one day," said Matteucci. "Coach Comeau talks about these amazing athletes like (All-Scholastics) Chris McConnell and the Veteres (Mark and Adam), and to think we could do something like that one day is really an honor."

For Eberth, also a football star, success in running was only natural. After all, he grew up around the Eugene V. Lovely Field track watching his sister Sydney Eberth, the 2011 EMass. Division 1 champion in 400.

"My sister was an amazing runner," said Eberth. "I would always be at her meets watching her run. I wanted to follow in her

footsteps. Plus, I'm good friends with coach Comeau's son Mikey, so I always knew I was going to play football in the fall then do track in the winter and spring."

Eberth wasted no time making an impact this winter, running on the winning 4x200 and taking fourth in the 300 at the MVC freshman/sophomore meet.

"Coach Comeau knew I was kind of fast," he said. "And for the first meet he put me in the JV heat and I did really well. So he started putting me in the varsity meets and I kept doing well. I love track. It's a lot of fun."

But, going out for the sport was not a given for other members of this group. For Matteucci, the

decision to try track happened by luck.

"Basketball was always my sport," he said. "But my freshman year I got cut from the team. I still wanted a sport, so I decided to give track a shot."

"The first day I was in the hurdles trials and did really well. Coach Comeau came over and told me, 'You are doing hurdles, and you are going to be great.' I really started to get confident after I took second (in the 110 hurdles) at the freshman/sophomore meet."

For Marotta, it took some encouragement from home.

"As a freshman I played football then didn't play a spring sport," he said. "So my parents convinced me to try track. I didn't think I was

going to like it, and was just doing it because I was supposed to.

"But once I tried the discus, I realized I was pretty good at it. And I really liked it! Against North Andover last year I threw 90 feet in the discus. That isn't so good, but it showed me I could get better."

Marotta has continued to grow in the sport, throwing a 110 in the discus and 112 in the javelin in the season-opener last week.

Silveira's interest in track was peaked all the way back in elementary school.

"I started running track in sixth grade and it was a lot of fun," said Silveira, the younger brother of basketball star Max. "I started doing well in all the races and started to believe I could do well."

"Last year I got sixth at MVCs in the 400 (53.48) and was thinking to myself, 'alright!' It makes you work harder every day when you have expectations."

Pineault nearly went out for tennis this spring, his freshman year, but changed his mind in the winter.

"I knew I was going to run cross country," he said. "And I liked that and winter track so much, I decided to stick with track this spring. I really like it."

And then there is Naveed, a self-described "individual" and lover of neon.

"I knew I was fast when I was always running faster than my friends at recess," he said. "I thought track was the best way to go, and I liked it right away."

He began to impress last spring, scoring victories and running the team's top time for the season in the 200 (23.39).

"Winning is a great feeling," he said. "The freshmen and sophomores are the future of this team, and we want a championship."

Comeau believes that is far from a long shot.

"This is an outstanding group," he said. "I think we will have a great 4x400 team of Eberth, Naveed, Silveira and Matt Reardon as the only upperclassman. And once you establish a good 4x400, a whole lot can happen."
