## Pipeline proposal to get airing

Less than a week after the town manager issued a cease-and-desist order against pipeline workers trying to survey residents' properties, the company that wants to build

a high-pressure natural gas line through town agreed to convene a meeting to answer questions about the controversial project.

Representatives of Kinder Morgan Energy Partners and its subsidiary, Tennessee Gas Pipeline Company, will give a two-hour

presentation about the pipeline proposal followed by a question-and-answer session on Tuesday, July 9, at 7 p.m. in the auditorium of Wood Hill Middle School on Cross Street.

Town Manager Reginald "Buzz" Stapeczynski said he expects as many as 400

to 500 people to attend, which is why the meeting is being held in the Wood Hill auditorium.

"We are expecting a big turnout," Stapeczynski said.

Last week, the town manager issued a

## Manager leaves health trust

Stapeczynski resigns benefits group amid conflict questions

Citing what he called a "distraction," Town Manager Reginald "Buzz" Stapeczynski has resigned as trustee of an organization that has been providing health insurance to municipal employees and their families for the last five years.

Stapeczynski informed members of the Board of Selectmen earlier this month that he would step down from the Health Benefits Trust of the Massachusetts Interlocal Insurance Association, or MIIA, which has offered Blue Cross/Blue Shield health coverage to the town's 1,400 employees and

## Finegold sprints to lead in fundraising

## 'Be nice' policy OK'd

It could be called the "Be Nice to a Public Servant" policy.

Or, on the flip side, the "Be Nice to Taxpayers" policy.

The Board of Selectmen has approved new policies proposed by Town Manager Reginald "Buzz" Stapeczynski aimed at improving customer service for taxpayers, while at the same time protecting town employees from violent or irrational residents.

"When I hear from town employees that they are afraid to come to work, a policy is needed so those employees know that there are people up there (selectmen) who care about them," Stapeczynski said during a selectmen's meeting

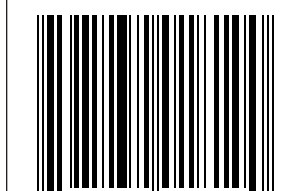

cease-and-desist order against surveyors working for Tennessee Gas who had been knocking on doors, sending letters and making phone calls to owners of property that may be on the path of the proposed, new pipeline.

After getting a series of complaints from residents reporting heavy-handed tactics by energy company surveyors, Stapczynski sent a letter demanding that they cease all of their activities in Andover until an information session could be scheduled on the pipeline proposal.

The company called to arrange the meeting shortly after receiving the letter.

Kinder Morgan and Tennessee Gas have held numerous public forums across the state and much of the Northeast to present their plans for a pipeline that runs from Wright, N.Y., to Dracut, with feeder lines, known as "laterals," running from Dracut into Methuen, Haverhill, Andover and beyond.

The so-called Lynnfield lateral would run from a central hub in Dracut into Methuen before heading south through Andover along the Tewksbury line. It would then cross into North Reading before hitting Lynnfield.

The Haverhill lateral would run north, through part of Methuen and along an

existing pipeline corridor in Haverhill.

It is the Lynnfield lateral that would have the most impact on Andover, because it is new and does not follow an existing easement, according to maps provided by the company.

Andover Conservation Commission Agent Bob Douglas said the company wants to install a 30-inch pipe that would require a 50-foot-wide easement. He said conservation agents across the state are opposed to it because of the damage it would inflict on wetlands and other natural areas as a result of clearing and cutting needed to install the pipe.

The Massachusetts Association of Conservation Commissions sent a letter to Gov. Deval Patrick in May opposing the project, saying "the pipeline will result in a permanent 50-foot-wide swath of about

250 miles in length, much of it through ecologically sensitive lands, on which trees could not grow and structures not be built."

The project has given rise to a number of opposition groups, including the Massachusetts Pipeline Awareness Network, or MassPLAN.org, which was set up to share information among municipalities that are engaged in resistance to the proposed Kinder Morgan pipeline, according to Katy Eiseman, the group's director.

Another group, the Middlesex County Coalition of Municipalities, is made up of communities such as Pepperell, Townsend and Groton. It is holding its first meeting next week.

The Mass. Audubon Society has declined a request by Tennessee Gas to survey its properties, saying such activity would threaten many rare and endangered species.

The gas company, meanwhile, seems to have antagonized people not just in Andover, but in other communities as well.

In Dracut, where there has already been one information session attended by hundreds of residents, the chairman of the Board of Selectmen sought another information forum, but the gas company declined.

Town Manager James Duggan said community leaders are losing patience with Tennessee Gas.

"I explained (to a company representative) that there

appears to be a level of frustration and uncertainty about where the line is going to be," Duggan said. "He told me they are still evaluating the placement of the line."

Duggan said it's unclear not only where the gas line is going, but where it's going to end in Dracut.

Plans presented by the gas company indicate that there will be a compression station in Dracut. Duggan said he hadn't seen specific plans showing where that would be placed.

"Where does it end in Dracut?" he asked. "We don't even know that."

There is a similar sense of frustration in Andover and Tewksbury, which share a border and would share the path of the pipeline.

Joan Unger, who lives on Cardigan Road in Tewksbury, said she owns 2 acres of property, more than two-thirds of which are in Andover. She said gas company representatives knocked on her door in February, handed her an envelope and asked her to sign a document giving them permission to survey her property.

"The pipeline was on two sides of my house," she said, referring to a map that was reluctantly sent to her by a company official. "I wouldn't sign it."

Tewksbury held an information session this week — on Tuesday night — during which gas company officials made the same kind of presentation expected to be made in Andover on July 9.

last month, when he first introduced the policy.

Selectmen approved it unanimously following a second reading at a subsequent meeting. But they also asked the town manager to come up with ways to measure customer satisfaction in town.

Selectman Alex Vispoli noted that customer service was one of the goals selectmen had set for Stapczynski last year in an effort to improve the experience for taxpayers doing business with Town Hall.

"Our primary reason for that goal was customer service from the inside out," said Vispoli, who also asked the town manager if he was providing an update on that policy goal.

Stapczynski said this summer, a human resources expert would be in town training employees how to improve their interactions with customers.

"It could be simple things, like better signage in the hallways telling you where to pay a bill," he said.

## CODE OF CONDUCT

For residents, taxpayers and others doing business with the town:

"The town does not tolerate workplace violence, including threats of violence by anyone who conducts business in or works for the town.

"The town will not tolerate harassing conduct that affects conditions, which interfere unreasonably with an individual's performance or creates an intimidating, bullying, hostile or offensive environment for visitors or staff."

The policy includes a list of do's and don'ts:

- Show respect for yourself, others ...
- Avoid causing disturbances or disruptions.
- Use common courtesy ... by following the Golden Rule: "Do unto others as you would have them do unto you."

The policy also notes, "Repeat violations will be brought to the attention of the Andover Police Department and could result in the suspension of facility privileges."

But Stapczynski seemed to indicate that the real purpose of the new policy was to improve the experience for town workers.

## CUSTOMER SERVICE POLICY

For town employees helping residents/taxpayers:

"Quality service will be delivered with respect for the needs and diversity of all residents in the community. The term 'customer' includes residents, taxpayers, staff, elected officials, volunteers and the general public."

The policy includes these do's and don'ts:

- Respect the diversity of our community ...
- Promote excellence ...
- Identify creative and innovative approaches to serve customers.
- Respect the knowledge and perspective of customers and respond to their ideas and concerns.

"One of the things in the municipal world ... is the tension between people coming in and asking for services and people delivering those services," he said. "We need to have a level of customer service, an expectation and a code of conduct, so when people come in they will be treated properly and taken care of

properly, so we don't have to call for a police officer. We are looking for civility. So we are looking on both sides.

"By in large, we don't have problems. But recently, employees have come to me, worried about certain issues. We've had to ask people not to come into certain buildings."

Some taxpayers, he said, "use the telephone as a weapon" to badger town employees. He related the story of an employee who told him he had to hang up on a customer who was getting belligerent.

"I said, 'You are not paid to take abuse,'" Stapczynski said.

Selectmen initially seemed more concerned about the way taxpayers were getting treated.

"It's important that taxpayers have a certain expectation of us," Selectman Paul Salafia said. "They need to know they will be treated well."

Selectman Mary O'Donoghue said she'd always been treated respectfully by town staff, but said that if there were "isolated cases" where residents had been abusive toward town workers, "that's different. We need to keep a balance."

Mary Carbone of Cyr Circle, a frequent critic of board policies who has been escorted out of meetings by police, said taxpayers "have to stand up for your rights. The residents are paying (town employee) salaries and they should be treated with respect."

Police Chief Pat Keefe, who was in the audience on a different matter, said he supported the town manager's proposal.

He said there had been some recent incidents involving members of the public and town workers and added that no-trespass orders could be issued against people for repeat violations.

Anyone caught breaking a no-trespass order could be arrested, although Keefe said he didn't think it would ever get to that.

# Tensions mount over Dufton Road 'blight' property

Pressure continues to build on the residents of 2 Dufton Road to clean up their foreclosed property as town and bank officials argue over who is responsible for several botched eviction attempts.

Meanwhile, one of the residents was arrested earlier this month for allegedly impeding a firefighter who was attempting to extinguish an outdoor cooking fire in the front yard.

Neighbors have plastered utility poles in the neighborhood with posters proclaiming "What a Shame!" over an image of old stoves, computer monitors and other assorted junk piled up outside the Dufton Road property.

"Do you know the owner of 2 Dufton Road?" the poster asks. "The owner of record for this foreclosed property is U.S. Bank."

The posters, underscored by "Unite Against Blight," were put up by former Selectman Ted Teichert, who lives at 5 Dufton Road, just across the street.

Teichert said he and neighbors are trying every means possible to get the property cleaned up, and have even created lawn signs they will be putting up around town to pressure the town into doing something.

Their tactics seem to be working.

Andover Building Inspector Chris Clemente has filed a legal motion with the Land Court asking that U.S. Bank "remove ... all second-hand junk or scrap material or worn out, cast-off discarded material, which is ready for destruction or collection for

salvage ... and also vehicles within the view of any public way or abutting residential property, which are not validly registered and inspected ... and also all unused railroad ties."

Joe Boyer, who occupies the multi-family house with his wife, Nancy, their two young children, as well as two tenants, said he received the motion last Friday afternoon, but wasn't quite sure how to respond.

"They are still trying to get the yard cleaned up," he said. "This was in Land Court in 2008 once the house went into foreclosure. The judge refused to issue an execution on this (clean-up order), because he didn't know who owned the property. Now, there's all this uproar and pressure, from Ted and the neighbors, to do something. They are pressuring the town — so now Chris (Clemente) is sending this attempt by ordering the bank to clean it up."

He said in speaking to his legal adviser, it's unclear what will happen next.

"Nobody understands the

precedent," he said. "They don't understand who has the obligation. All this stuff is being run through the ringer. I don't have time for this. I have to have my appeal ready and perfected in a couple of weeks."

Earlier this month, on June 4, Boyer fended off an eviction attempt by the Essex County Sheriff's office by producing documents showing he had appealed a previous dismissal of his appeal to have him and his family removed from the property. The deputies decided against evicting him until they could verify whether the eviction would be legal.

Boyer's appeal is scheduled to be heard in Housing Court some time in the next couple of months.

The June 4 incident set off somewhat of a tirade by the attorney for U.S. Bank, who sent a lengthy email to town officials, in part lambasting the local Police Department for failing to back his efforts at having the Boyers evicted.

"This situation has been exacerbated by the Andover Police Department and their complete refusal to assist my constable when he attempted to levy on the execution MULTIPLE TIMES," Anthony Coletti of Harmon Law Offices in Newton wrote. "Had the Andover police assisted my constable, we could have had possession of this property. Instead they refused, so I was required to send the execution to the sheriff, who is way more conservative, but has the ability to take people into custody."

Police Chief Patrick Keefe responded, saying his officers went to Boyer's property in January after Boyer

called them to report there was someone on his property "telling him he had to leave."

Keefe said that the private constable working for Harmon Law was attempting to evict Boyer, but that Boyer had paperwork stating his eviction was in appeal. The officers confirmed that with the Housing Court and advised the private constable to go back to court to rectify the situation.

"I was then contacted by the constable and was asked why the Andover officers did not support him during the eviction process," Keefe wrote. "I informed him that the officers are there to keep the peace. I instructed him that he or the bank should contact the Essex County Sheriff's Office Civil Process section located in Lawrence and Salem. I informed him that this has been the process in the past that we are accustomed to in Essex County."

He finished by saying, "The Andover Police Department does not take its legal advice from attorney Coletti."

Meanwhile, things haven't gotten any easier for Boyer. A couple Wednesday nights ago, he said he and his family were enjoying an outdoor "cooking fire" in the yard when a fire truck showed up after a neighbor called to complain.

"I've been doing fires for eight years," Boyer said. "It's nothing new or dangerous."

He said firefighters checked out the fire and were getting ready to leave when a police car showed up. He said that's when a firefighter grabbed Boyer's garden hose. As he was getting ready to spray it,

Boyer intervened. He said he stood between the firefighter and the fire, preventing him from spraying water on it.

Next, he said, the firefighter went to get the hose off his fire truck, and when Boyer intervened again, he was grabbed by a police officer and arrested. He was charged at 9:45 p.m. for "interfering with a firefighter," according to the Andover police log.

Boyer said it's all part of the effort to oust him from the home he has owned since 1988 and which the bank has been trying to take from him illegally.

"It's getting hot and heavy here," Boyer said.

# Suspected heroin overdose claims local woman

A 19-year-old girl who lives on Stevens Street has reportedly become the town's first drug overdose victim this year, according to police and fire officials.

The girl was found in her room by family members on June 15 at about 10:30 a.m., Fire Chief Michael Mansfield said.

Firefighters were unable to administer Narcan — a nasal spray that revives heroin addicts — because she had been deceased for too long, he said.

"It was too late," Mansfield said, adding that it appears she died of an overdose of an opiate-based substance, most likely heroin.

"It's a tragedy," he said. "It's very sad. She had her whole

life in front of her."

Police detectives were called to the scene, as were counselors from TIP, or Trauma Intervention Program, of Andover. The medical examiner was also called in.

Police spokesman Commander Charles Heseltine said while "it appears to be a drug overdose," the actual cause of death won't be known until after the medical examiner has filed a toxicology report.

He said the case remains under investigation. He refused to comment any further.

If it is confirmed as a drug overdose death, it would be the first in Andover this year. Last year, two young people died of heroin overdoses.

A number of hospitalizations due to heroin and other opiate-based drugs were also

reported.

Andover is not alone in battling the problem. Gov. Deval Patrick declared a statewide public emergency last January as a way to bring attention and funding to the war on opiates.

Last November, Andover held a public forum attended by hundreds of people to talk about the drug problem.

Parents, police, youth workers and many young Andover residents spoke about the growing problem of not only drug use and abuse, but also depression, anxiety and the pressures of daily life.

Since the forum was held and the statewide public emergency declared, Police Chief Patrick Keefe has installed a prescription drug drop-box in the lobby of the Public Safety Center, Mansfield has put Narcan nasal spray kits on every

fire truck and ambulance in town, and Town Meeting approved spending an additional \$60,000 to pay for a drug outreach counselor working for the Department of Youth Services.

Since Narcan was introduced in the Fire Department, at least two people have been brought back from near-death as a result of the nasal spray, which reverses the effects of opiate-based drugs by inducing breathing in overdose victims.

The prescription drug drop-box has already been emptied twice, with hundreds, if not thousands, of pills being destroyed at the Covanta incinerator in Haverhill.

The drug counselor has not been hired yet by the Department of Youth Services. AYS Director Bill Fahey could not be reached for comment.

## Finance.

Former Brookline selectwoman Deborah Goldberg, a Democrat, had \$104,000, according to the most recent filings, and Rep. Thomas Conroy, D-Wayland, had about \$64,000.

Republican Mike Heffernan, who faces the winner of the three-way Democratic primary, had \$89,734.

The state's current treasurer, Democrat Steven Grossman, is running for governor.

At the Democratic convention in Worcester on June 14, Goldberg topped the balloting for the party's official endorsement with 39 percent of the vote, followed by Conroy with 34 percent. Finegold finished third with 27 percent, but it was still above the 15 percent required to put his name on the primary ballot.

Voters will ultimately decide the party's choice for treasurer, in the Sept. 9 primary election.

A recent poll suggests the race is wide open. A Suffolk University/Boston Herald survey of 800 likely voters from June 4 through 7 found about 74 percent who said they are undecided. Among the rest, 10.7 percent were going for Goldberg, 8.4 percent for Finegold and 4.4 percent for Conroy.

The treasurer's job, which pays \$127,916 a year, oversees about 100 employees and a budget of nearly \$9.3 million, the state lottery as well as employee retirement, school construction, cash and borrowing programs. The treasurer also heads a board that manages state pension funds.

Unlike the governor's race, the campaign for treasurer is generally a low-key affair that doesn't garner much money or attention.

In 2010, Grossman collected \$1.8 million in the race against Republican Karyn Polito, who collected about \$1 million, according to the campaign finance office. All three candidates in the race raised \$3.4 million.

Candidates for governor, by comparison, collected \$15 million.

Finegold, a lawyer, was elected to the Senate's 2nd

Essex and Middlesex district four years ago after serving 13 years as a state representative. He was reelected to the Senate in 2012 with 65 percent of the vote. He also ran unsuccessfully for U.S. Congress in 2007, losing in a special election to Democrat Niki Tsongas.

In a campaign video, a montage of Democratic lawmakers and other supporters praise Finegold's work on election reform and other issues as a narrator waxes about his humble roots growing up in a Hyde Park housing complex.

"Nobody has given me anything," Finegold, 43, said Monday. "I've worked hard and earned every dollar I've made and will protect taxpayer money in the same way as treasurer."

Finegold said he wants to boost returns to the state's pension system, if elected, and improve financial literacy among middle and high school students.

Goldberg, 59, is a Brookline native who served six years on the

town's Board of Selectmen, including two stints as chairwoman. She ran for lieutenant governor in 2006, but lost in the Democratic primary to Tim Murray.

Goldberg said she wants to use the treasurer's office to help bring about social change, including pushing businesses to hire more women and minorities and divesting fossil fuel investments from the state's \$57 billion pension fund.

Conroy, 51, has been a legislator since 2007 and chairs the Joint Committee on Labor and Workforce Development. He ran for U.S. Senate in 2011 but dropped out after Elizabeth Warren entered the race. He has pledged to use state school funds to build classrooms for pre-kindergarten students, if elected.

Heffernan, a financial adviser and high-tech entrepreneur from Wellesley, said he wants to increase local aid, improve schools and invest in communities. On the campaign, he has portrayed himself as a political outsider with real-world business experience.

Arlington activist Ian Jackson, a member of the Green-Rainbow party, is also running.

Regardless of who emerges from the primary, Heffernan faces an uphill battle. Democrats outnumber Republicans about 3-to-1 among registered voters, and the state has only elected one Republican to the treasurer's office in the past 60 years.

Despite Finegold's fundraising advantage, his competitors point out that he has raised big money and still lost previous elections. He collected more than \$700,000 for his 2007 congressional bid, according to the Federal Elections Commission, but finished fourth in the Democratic primary.

"Barry's lead in fundraising hasn't translated to support in the ballot box," Conroy said. "He's No. 1 in fundraising but last on the ballot."

retirees since 2010.

"Effective today, I'm resigning as a trustee of the MIIA Health Benefits Trust," he wrote in a June 13 letter to selectmen, which wasn't made public until late last week after the Townsman learned of its existence.

The resignation comes after months of discussion and controversy over how Stapczynski handled health insurance negotiations with the town's unions. The town put the health insurance contract out to bid last year, getting two bids — one from Tufts and the other from MIIA.

The Tufts bid came in at a price well below the MIIA bid, but the town's unions chose MIIA anyway, saying they were more comfortable with the Blue Cross/Blue Shield coverage town workers have had for years. Prior to its involvement with MIIA, the town had a direct contract with Blue Cross/Blue Shield.

But questions were raised about whether Stapczynski's close relationship with MIIA represented a conflict of interest that could have affected his presentation of the competing plans to the unions.

Stapczynski said he resigned even though there was no conflict of interest.

"The basic issue is that we are going out to bid again in the fall," he said. "I don't want it to be a distraction. This is an important item for the town. The distraction may take precedence on what we are really trying to do, which is to control our health care costs. The town takes precedence over MIIA."

"If anything, it (the resignation) reduces some of the noise or music people were creating around the whole issue of our employees' health insurance — what people thought was a conflict which was not."

In his statement, he said: "As you recall last June in accordance with the state ethics law, I made a disclosure to you that I was a trustee, and that also my family was

on the town's health insurance plan. You voted 5-0 to acknowledge that my position as trustee was not so substantial as to be deemed likely to affect the integrity of the services to the town.

"Nonetheless, I have resigned as trustee to put the matter behind us, so we can move forward and focus on what is important — providing an employee health insurance plan next year without any unwarranted distractions."

While Stapczynski called it a distraction, others see it as a little more than that.

Selectmen Chairman Dan Kowalski said he thinks Stapczynski did the right thing by resigning.

"He took the right approach moving forward," Kowalski said. "I wasn't surprised. It was the appropriate thing to do, speaking as one selectman."

Kowalski contends that while Stapczynski may not have benefited financially from his association with MIIA, there could still be an appearance of conflict of interest because of that relationship.

"There are other conflicts than financial," he said. "In my personal opinion."

Bob Landry, a local resident who spearheaded an unsuccessful effort at Town Meeting to cut the town's health insurance budget, went further, saying that Stapczynski is being disingenuous.

"This is too little, too late," he said. "What is the reason for resigning now? It's curious he waited until after Town Meeting to resign."

He noted that while Stapczynski resigned from the Health Trust, he remains on the MIIA governing board and also remains on the MIIA Reinsurance Company, which handles large municipal claims.

"This seems to be kind of a

drip-drip-drip," Landry said. "He discloses these issues only when he's confronted with the idea that people are asking about it. That conflict has existed for some time. Why did he feel compelled to release that information last year?"

Selectman Alex Vispoli said Stapczynski has always been up front about his relationship with MIIA.

"I thought it was a good decision for him to resign, although he's always been up front with the board with his membership and involvement with MIIA," he said. "But this removes an appearance of conflict of interest."

He and other selectmen said this should improve negotiations with the unions over the next year or so.

"We plan on putting the insurance contract out to bid earlier," Vispoli said. "That process is going to go forward sooner so we get the most competitive pricing for the town's health insurance."

Selectman Paul Salafia said Stapczynski is above reproach on this matter and any other.

"I know him well enough," he said. "I know it (membership in the Health Trust) didn't for one moment affect his thinking. He's a man of great integrity. He really is. He felt other people were questioning it, so why have the distraction. I fully support him. We all thought, at the time, and still do, that it didn't affect his integrity and the services of the town or any of his decisions. He just doesn't want to have the distraction. And why should he?"

Selectman Mary O'Donoghue said she also wasn't surprised by the move.

"After all of the controversy about it during Town Meeting and after, I think he made the right decision," she said. "I think there certainly was a perception of conflict of interest, and in today's world, perception is very important. I think it can only help with negotiations. You now have somebody going into the room (with the unions) who will go to bat for the town, and that perceived conflict of interest will no longer be there."

Selectman Brian Major did not return a phone call.

## A call for civility a matter of common sense

This spring, outgoing Selectwoman Mary Lyman issued a challenge to her fellow townspeople on her way out of office — show each other some respect.

Lyman, who spent more than 20 years in public service starting in 1992 on the School Committee followed by a dozen or so years as selectwoman, said the tone of civic dialogue had grown too contentious for her to bear.

Indeed, it was one of the reasons she had chosen not to seek a fifth term as selectwoman.

She recalled being yelled at, having a shopping cart pushed in her path at a grocery store, being threatened with lawsuits and being labeled along with other elected officials as “idiots.”

That type of behavior obviously is not right — or particularly constructive. And no one should have to be subjected to it.

But is legislating good behavior really necessary?

The town manager seems to think so, and the Board of Selectmen happens to agree.

Last month, at the request of Town Manager Reginald “Buzz” Stapczynski, selectmen approved new policies that include a code of conduct for the public to follow when doing business with the town.

Among the “do’s” listed in the code are: show respect for oneself and others, avoid causing disturbances and disruptions, and use common courtesy by following the Golden Rule — “Do unto others as you would have them do unto you.”

Those who don’t follow the rules risk being banned from town offices. And violators of no-trespass orders could face arrest, although the police chief himself says he didn’t

think it would ever come to that.

The fact that such a code is even necessary seems unfathomable.

As children, most of us are taught good behavior by our parents, rules of decorum that are reinforced by our teachers, coaches, Scoutmasters and spiritual leaders. We learn we are responsible for our actions and there are consequences if we misbehave.

As adults, do we really need a formal policy to be reminded of that?

Stapczynski told selectmen that some town employees have been afraid to come to work because of violent or irrational residents.

“A policy is needed so those employees know that there are people up there (selectmen) who care about them,” he told the board.

No job is immune from the occasional difficult customer, coworker or client. Indeed, police have even been called to public meetings to escort out individuals who have become unruly or hostile. But those instances are few and far between.

As a companion to the code of conduct is a customer service policy for town employees also largely built on respect.

Improving customer service — “from the inside out” as Selectman Alex Vispoli suggests — is one of the goals selectmen set for Stapczynski last year.

To that end, a human resources expert will be in town this summer training town workers.

The town manager acknowledges the quest for civility extends to both sides.

We can only hope that comes from within individuals — both the public and those charged with serving them — so that more policies and codes are not needed to dictate common sense, decorum and mature behavior.

## Anguish, loss transcend a ‘few hours’ at Spotsylvania



### Andover Stories

On the morning of May 19, 1864, the Andover men in Company H awoke to a day “beautiful almost beyond description.” The battle that followed at Spotsylvania was anything but.

The Andover soldiers at last had come face-to-face with the enemy. Immediately after their initial volley, the Confederates charged the Andover men, and the fighting quickly degenerated into hand-to-hand combat in some places.

While the remainder of the Regiment came to their defense, many wounded Andover soldiers retreated as best they could. E.K. Jenkins wrote of one, Augustine Russell, who, while attempting to carry a wounded soldier off the field, was shot in the hand and leg, escaping death only by “creeping from the field on hand and knee.” After withstanding two more Confederate charges in a span of just “a few hours,” these Andover men and their brethren won the field.

General Meade, commander of the Army of the Potomac, praised the Andover Company and its

fellow units: “The gallant manner in which these commands, the greater portion being for the first time under fire, met and checked the persistent attack ... justifies the Commanding General in this Special Commendation of troops, who, henceforward will be relied upon.”

The Andover soldiers suffered dearly for their victory. Although news of the battle reached town in two days, it would take longer for Andover’s residents to learn seven of the town’s men had died on the field and seven more would later die from their wounds. Andover residents would later learn that one captured Andover man died in Maryland after being released and another captured Andover

soldier died of starvation at Andersonville.

Twenty-four other Andover citizens had been wounded seriously enough to be hospitalized, four of them surviving only after enduring amputations.

Such figures do not describe the anguish and void left in the wake of so much death and dismemberment. Numbers do not describe the darkness that descended on so many families and friends when learning a loved one had died or was wounded. Statistics fail to address the trauma survivors would suffer for years to come.

We do know 39-year-old Augustine Russell, father of three, survived the battle after undergoing an amputation of his lower leg. Russell would go on to father two more children and serve in the Massachusetts House of Representatives, but only after undergoing a second amputation in 1870.

We also know the soldier

Augustine Russell had tried to carry off the field was 37-year-old Epaphrus Bryant, an Andover artist and father of three, Flora Belle, Frank and Virginia, aged 7, 5 and 15 months respectively. Bryant made it to a Union hospital where his right tibia, shattered by a Confederate ball, was amputated. However, he was not as fortunate as Russell. Bryant died 42 days later in a Washington hospital from blood poisoning, his wife left destitute and his children fatherless.

In the end, Russell and Bryant were just two of the Andover men who risked everything during the war. Although the full tally of those who returned from the war shattered physically and emotionally remains unknown, we do know that, from just a “few hours” of fighting at Spotsylvania, many endured unimaginable hardships and that so many Andover lives had been changed forever.

## Sutliff stars in Shriners Football Classic

Many of the top graduating football players in the state gathered at Bentley University in Waltham over the weekend, and front and center was Andover's Matt Sutliff.

The former Golden Warrior offensive lineman started at right guard for the North squad in the elite Shriners Football All-Star Game this past Saturday, helping his team win 27-18.

"There's no way I ever could have imagined this," said Sutliff of being chosen to the elite squad. "If you had asked me junior year if I would have been going to the Shriners game, I would have said 'No way.' It really is an honor to be here. I am so excited."

Sutliff, who started at left tackle

for the Warriors for two seasons, said it was a dream to go from being cut from his eighth-grade team to being picked for the Shriners, helping the North to victory for the first time in five seasons.

"It's really such a huge honor," said Sutliff, who will play his college ball at Hobart College in New York. "It's crazy. I can't even explain how exciting it is. To be playing in this is one of the highlights of my football career."

The hulking 6-foot-3, 280-pound Sutliff was one of just seven players from the Merrimack Valley Conference elected to the team, and the only Golden Warrior to be picked.

"It was actually funny because when I was selected, coach (E.J.) Perry called me," he said. "He told me not to tell anyone, but my

parents. I'm not sure why, but I think he might have wanted to make sure I was really selected. I wasn't sure.

"There were so many great guys from Andover. (Will) Eikenberry, (Jack) Sylvester, (Ben) Hartford, John Oteri. Any of them could have been picked. To be the only one is really humbling."

Having battled through plenty of challenges throughout his career, Sutliff said he is proud of his high school career now that he has played his final game in an Andover helmet.

"I always thought that if I put my mind to it, I was going to be able to do it," he said. "I never thought anything could stop me from doing what I wanted to do. It has all come down to hard work. I really think I am the most excited player on the field."

The time has arrived. Baseballs, bats, hurdles and lacrosse sticks have been safely packed away as summer is officially in full bloom.

The 2014 spring sports season has come to a close at Andover High, but not before delivering another season of thrills and excitement.

It was a season that saw the baseball team advance to the Division 1 state semifinals — its best tourney run in nearly 10 years, track star Sebastian Silveira go from hurdles newcomer to starring at Nationals, Nicole Ericson return to the softball diamond and fine seasons from lacrosse to volleyball.

Oh, and then there was the girls tennis team, which took home a thrilling state title.

Here is a look back at some of the greatest moments and biggest stars from the 2014 Golden Warriors spring season.

### Title town

What more can be said about the amazing season for the girls tennis team?

The Golden Warriors flew through the regular season undefeated, then multiple stars took turns coming through in the clutch to lock down the state title.

Whether it was Courtney Nash in the first round, Samantha Camilo in the North finals, Karena Yan in the state semifinals or the doubles team of Laurie-Maude Chenard and Sydney Ferry in the title match, when the meet was on the line, the Golden Warriors always found a way to play like champions.

### Baseball breakthrough

With a combination of brilliant pitching and explosive hitting, Andover baseball advanced all the

way to the Division 1 state semifinals, its best showing in the playoffs since the 2005 season.

Reid Bryant's complete-game three-hitter led the Warriors to an upset over Malden Catholic, Gabe Hernandez was the surprise hero with a game-winning two-run triple in the North title game and Sam Bennett was brilliant throughout, even in the state semifinal loss.

Third baseman Frank Potts finished the year as the Warriors' top hitter, batting .452 with 16 RBIs and 12 runs scored.

Tommy John surgery may have prevented Alex Brickman from pitching, but it sure didn't stop him from hitting. He finished with a .428 batting average and 15 RBIs. Despite spending most of the year in the leadoff spot, Tim Awiszus drove in a team-high 20 runs to go with his .400 average, while freshman E.J. Perry IV matched that batting average while scoring and driving in 18 runs.

On the mound, Bryant finished with a miniscule 0.67 ERA and Colin Flynn led the team in wins (5) and strikeouts (49).

Ask just about anyone involved in track, and they will tell you the hurdles are the most grueling events to take on.

As a freshman, Sebastian Silveira was jokingly told to stay as far away as possible from the hurdles. So who could have guessed what would happen this season.

Picking up the event out of curiosity — and necessity for the team — Silveira wasted no time becoming a star.

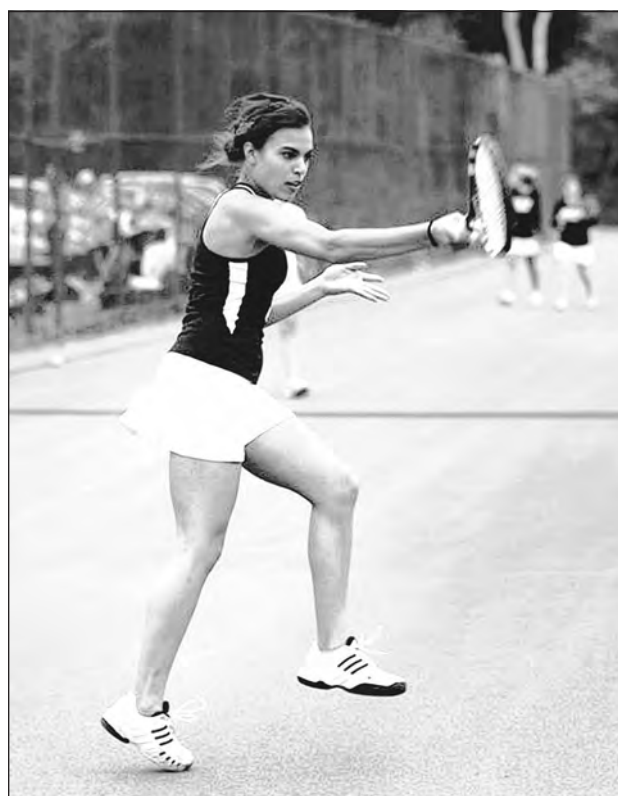
After taking second in the 400 hurdles at the Haverhill Invitational and Andover Boosters, Silveira won the MVC Meet title

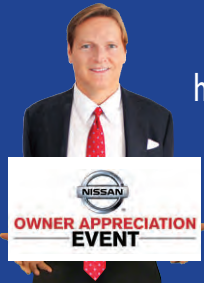

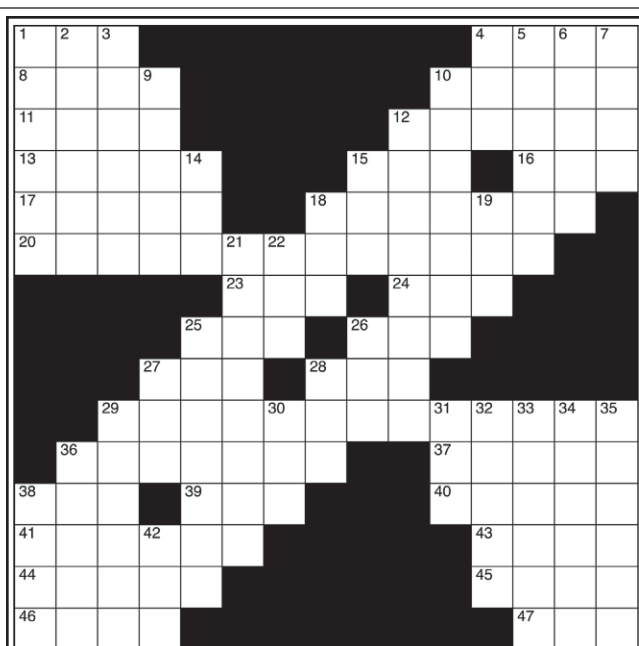
Behind 22 kills by Chase Webber, the volleyball team rallied to upset Lincoln-Sudbury 3-2 on May 6.
