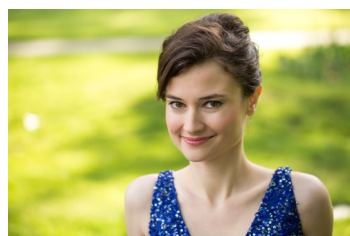
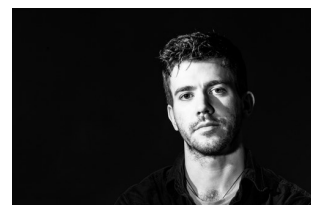

Memorial Hall Library has purchased subscriptions to three online databases from the Foundation Center, for organizations and individuals seeking funding for projects and other activities. All three are available for free to all library visitors.

Foundation Directory Online Professional

Get access to more than 140,000 expanded profiles on foundations and corporate donors, information on more than 7 million grants, and more than half a million key decision makers and leaders. 990 and 990-PF forms are keyword searchable.

Foundation Grants to Individuals Online

Find information about 10,000 foundation profiles at your fingertips, including foundation and public charity programs that have funded individual grant seekers for everything from scholarship opportunities to research needs. Updated weekly.

After you've checked out a title to stream, you can watch it as many times as you like over the next 48 hours.

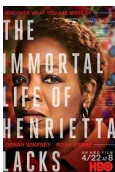

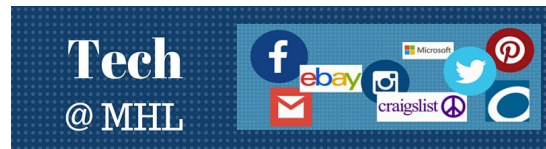
