Sail Low On the World: SLOW An Evening with Aline Dargie Wednesday, July 19 at 7pm



Andover native, Aline Dargie, and French photographer and chef, Julien Girardot, have embarked on a three year voyage named SLOW (Sail Low On the World). Aline will share some of her 'slow journalism' stories from their ecological project on the remote islands of French Polynesia in the South Pacific. They use slow, low impact methods of travel - sailing, walking, horseback riding, swimming, and paddling, and take the time to dive deep into local and evolving traditional ways of life. Using multimedia journalism, they edit their video, text and photos aboard their small Edelcat 35 catamaran, "Pizza," propelled by wind and powered by sun. 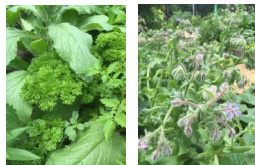
What's Growing in Andover?
