


This Rebel Heart




Last night at the Telegraph Club

owning her truth is worth everything she has ever known.




Luck of the Titanic

belong until seeds of unrest force her to decide what's best for her future.




Looking for stories about teens in different time periods? For everything from the Spanish Inquisition to American colonial times to the 1970s, try these Historical Fiction books!

by Margarita Engle


In this inspiring coming-of-age story set in 1920s Cuba, Rima finds the courage to protest for women's right to vote while falling in love for the first time.

his handler, undermine the regime, give voice to fellow Romanians, and expose to the world what is happening in his country.




Ophie's ghosts

prejudices to work beside a rival to protect their city from territorial gangsters.




A sitting in St. James

When Hazel, an aspiring female surgeon, meets Jack, a resurrection man who sells bodies for a living, they work together to uncover the secrets


buried not just in unmarked graves but in the very heart of Edinburgh society.




We are not free

the mass incarcerations of people of Japanese ancestry during World War II.




Two roads
