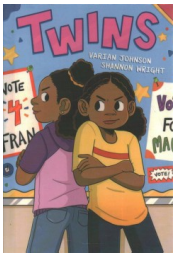
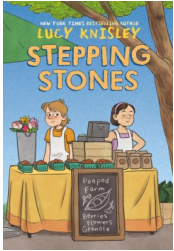

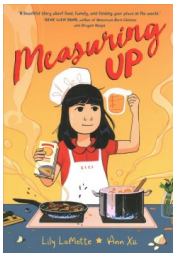

Stepping stones

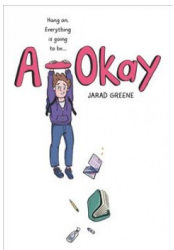

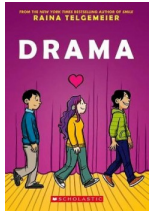
